Treasurer's Report

I'm pleased to report that we ended 2021 with a small surplus! In spite of, or maybe because of, the uncertainty that came with 2020, our chapter faced 2021 with renewed hope, vigour and determination. We hoped for a return to inperson activity but planned to stay remote and safe, with the knowledge that no matter how the pandemic developed, we could respond and provide robust programming, support and mentorship to our members.




We created a plan that met our goals of providing our members with thoughtful and inspirational, educational, professional development and networking opportunities, while also being careful stewards of our chapter finances. I think we accomplished both.

Our 2021 budget was built knowing that we might experience another deficit, albeit a smaller one, but also understanding that we are lucky enough to have the reserves in place to weather one more year of uncertainty. And with hard work and some luck, we would minimise any losses. And we succeeded! Careful planning kept expenses in check while still providing value that our members expect from AFP.

Revenue and Expenditures

During the 2021 fiscal year, AFP Manitoba had total revenue from all sources of \$109,139 and total expenditures of \$104,947 resulting in a surplus of \$4,192.

Revenues have begun to return to pre-pandemic levels for job postings. Member renewals held steady from 2020. While revenue from Professional Development sessions has not returned to previous levels because of continued virtual presentations, our team has found new ways to create value that our members have embraced. After only one year of an in-person hiatus (where the awards happened virtually), we were once again able to celebrate the Manitoba Philanthropy Awards in person!



Total Assets

At the end of fiscal year 2021, the chapter had total assets of \$88,773 up from \$82,224 in 2020. The 2021 assets include two term deposits (GIC and redeemable GIC) totaling \$35,232 and a high-interest account and a low-interest bearing chequing account with a combined balance of \$39,795. All accounts are held with Assiniboine Credit Union.

The 2022 budget includes a small deficit. We have planned for a return to in-person events, with some virtual events remaining as part of our world. We are grateful that the prudent investments of past boards continue to allow us to weather the uncertainty. And we're confident that with careful spending and increased member engagement we will more than likely emerge with another small surplus.







Membership

As we enter the second year of pandemic conditions, the support of fundraising professionals in Manitoba who have committed another year of membership with AFP is to be celebrated. Despite another challenging year, the AFP Manitoba Chapter stood strong with 166 members as of December 31, 2021 with an annual retention rate of 75% (on par with the international rate). New initiatives were launched in 2021 to increase chapter



engagement including Virtual Coffee Chats, #MemberMondays, and new member announcements on our social media channels.

Thank you to each and every member who joined us virtually and in person at our membership events and mixers throughout the year. This included our 2021 Annual General Meeting which, due to the continued health restrictions, was presented virtually. In early February, AFP Director of Chapter Engagement, Allison Sedwick led a virtual presentation on making the most of the membership experience. We hosted a series of Virtual Coffee Chats and in-person networking events at The Garden and The Wood Tavern. This year also commemorated AFP Manitoba's 25th Anniversary and we were thrilled to have been able to mark this milestone at our celebratory mixer in December at the Norwood Hotel. It was an engaging evening honouring our longest standing members, acknowledging our chapter's history and celebrating our chapter's members.

As we focus on the year ahead, we will continue offering maximum value for your membership through creative engagement and networking opportunities. Thank you for the work you do and for joining our voices to raise public awareness of philanthropy in Manitoba.

The Manitoba Chapter once again achieved AFP's "IDEA Champion" designation. Thanks to the enthusiasm and commitment of our members, we join chapters across Canada and the US who are making it a priority to ensure that the values of Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Access are embedded across their organisations.

On September 9, we were proud to take part in the official signing ceremony for the City of Winnipeg's Indigenous Accord, joining over 100 signatories. Although AFP Manitoba has been a member of the Indigenous Accord since 2019, due to COVID our official signing was delayed until 2021.

In March our membership had the opportunity to learn new perspectives about philanthropy and how it is practised around the world. AFP Manitoba's Past-President Sana Mahboob, and her friend Muhi Khwaja, Co-Founder of the American Muslim Community Foundation, led a session entitled Islam In Philanthropy. Guests joined the session from as far away as Texas, thanks to the wonders of Zoom.

During the fall of 2021 we hosted a series of five conversations focusing on various aspects of IDEA. The conversation series was intended as an opportunity for us, as professional fundraisers, to learn tools that help us put IDEA ideals and principles to work in our personal and professional lives, and to provide a safe place to ask difficult questions and have tough conversations.

IDEA Committee member Roxanne Tackie shared her reflections on Indigenous Allyship in response to the documentation of the children's remains at the former Kamloops Indian Residential School in June. Bryce Byron, another committee member shared zir reflections on the importance of Pride.



The conversations gave those of us who attended lots of food for thought and sparked great conversations. The IDEA Committee is planning a book/podcast club starting in 2022 to create a space for those conversations to continue. Also in 2022, we will be intentionally seeking out conversations with diverse communities to understand how AFP may be able to partner with them, and building understanding of other philanthropic perspectives, towards the goal of making AFP Manitoba and our membership fully reflective of the philanthropic work taking place in our community.

In 2021, AFP Manitoba continued to focus its communications strategy on member engagement.
