President's Report

On behalf of the Association of Fundraising Professionals, Manitoba Chapter, thank you to our members for once again ensuring the success of our Chapter during the first six months of 2022.

As we all transitioned back to face-to-face events and meetings in both our professional and personal lives in the first half of 2022, our Board of Directors and volunteer committees continued to create innovative and meaningful ways for our membership to connect, network, learn, and support each other. Most importantly, we continued to make an impact through acquisition and retention of members, scholarships and awards, professional development sessions, mentorship, government relations, sponsorships, the Every Member campaign, and communication to members from our Chapter. We prepared for the 2022 Manitoba Philanthropy Awards, and we focused on increasing diverse perspectives and fostering an inclusive environment in fundraising; including our continued commitment to Truth and Reconciliation.

This January 1st to June 30th timeframe represents a "stub" year for our AFP Chapter as we change our Board leadership and fiscal years to align with AFP Global. Leadership has spent the last few months pursuing the legal requirements to enact this change, and we will begin a new leadership year in January 2023. Our fiscal year must be adjusted as well to be compliant with incorporation guidelines in Manitoba and Chapter bylaws, and a July 1st to June 30th timeframe is being adopted to ensure we are in alignment.

Every year, AFP global honours chapters for achieving goals that align with key objectives in its long-range strategic plan. Chapters receive the Ten Star Gold Award for performing specific activities designed to increase professionalism within fundraising and public awareness of the importance of philanthropy. Just one-third of all AFP chapters are named Ten Star Chapters, and I'm proud that the Chapter is one of a select group of chapters to earn this honour.



Many thanks to the Board members who served AFP Manitoba during the first six months of this year, and to those who agreed to join the Board beginning in July. Many will continue to help lead our Chapter forward in 2023 as we continue to work hard to advance ethical and effective fundraising throughout our province. Thank you to our members for continuing to support our Chapter. We look forward to providing you with continued opportunities to maintain our strength and grow our impact.

<u> "Stub Year": January 1 - June 30, 2022</u>

As we move to a new fiscal year cycle, we have captured a snapshot of the first six months of 2022 as required by our bylaws. A year from now, at our next AGM, we will have a full year to look back on. As of June 30, though, I can report that neither I nor our accountant saw anything of concern in our finances. Revenues from job postings in the first six months have been strong, and if they continue the trend will exceed the budget.

Revenue and Expenditures

In the six month period ending June 30, 2022, AFP Manitoba had total revenue from all sources of \$24,402 and total expenditures of \$21,277 resulting in a surplus of \$3,128.

Total Assets

At the end of the six month period ending June 30, 2022, the chapter had total assets of \$108,114. The 2021 assets include two term deposits (GIC and redeemable GIC) totaling \$35,232 and a high-interest account and a low-interest bearing chequing account with a combined balance of \$60,465. All accounts are held with Assiniboine Credit Union.



Mentorship

Every year, AFP Manitoba connects and strengthens our fundraising community through our Mentorship Program. Seasoned professionals are paired with newer fundraisers, while aspiring leaders are paired with those with years of leadership experience. This program is open to all members in good standing, free of charge, as a gesture of our commitment to providing accessible professional development.

Mentors get to flex their coaching muscles, build their leadership skills, and build new connections in the nonprofit sector. Mentees can turn to their mentor for help setting goals, filling knowledge gaps, and sharing best practices.

From January 1st to June 30th 2022, 14 mentorship pairings were made, representing a 27% increase over the previous year. Our mentee participants this year included brand new fundraisers as well as established leaders in the sector looking to explore how to take the next step in their careers.

Government Relations

As fundraisers, we want to be viewed by policy makers as issue experts and trusted advisors. We need government stakeholders to understand the valuable role fundraisers play in creating a stronger, more resilient, and impactful charitable sector. By positioning the fundraising profession as a valuable partner to government, we can make the case for the policies, programs, and investments needed to support a strong charitable sector.

In early spring, the federal government released the 2022 budget and the charitable sector was included for a second year in a row! This highlights our significant contribution to the economy, and speaks volumes to the tireless advocacy efforts of AFP Canada's Government Relations Committee.

<u>Two significant announcements with direct impact to our sector were:</u>

- The increase of the disbursement quota from 3.5% to 5% for registered charities with assets exceeding \$1 million.
- The amendment of the Income Tax Act to allow charities to fund organizations other than "qualified donees." As the details were outlined, it was apparent the change would not be good for our sector. AFP joined a group of other organizations to advocate for change, specifically voicing the concern around the addition of "qualifying disbursements" which adds more direction and control instead of removing it.

We are pleased to be one of the leading organizations that continues to advocate for nonprofits across Canada.



I.D.E.A. & Ethics

The Manitoba Chapter once again achieved AFP's "Friends of Diversity" designation. Thanks to the enthusiasm and commitment of our members, we join chapters across Canada and the US who are making it a priority to ensure that the values of Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Access are embedded across their organizations.

In Manitoba, AFP represents a community of fundraising professionals and acts as a partner with people and organizations who want to create positive impact through philanthropy. We help professional fundraisers in this province create impact and affect change in their communities.

Our membership includes fundraisers who serve various organizations but we also recognize that AFP Manitoba's current membership does not represent the full richness and depth of philanthropy in Manitoba. The round tables will take place in the first half of 2023.

The IDEA Committee has also been exploring a collaboration with the AFP Edmonton Chapter I.D.E.A. & Ethics Committee with a plan to hold an IDEA Book Club in the fall of 2022.
