Awards Program:



The Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) sponsors an annual awards program to recognize outstanding achievement by individuals, foundation and corporate philanthropists, and fundraising volunteers. In professional fundraising, such individuals and organizations form a vital partnership that philanthropy must have to maintain its contribution to mankind. Therefore, it is right and proper that AFP honors those who hold high ethical standards and best exemplify commitment, dedication, and talent toward helping society. These awards are given in recognition to those individuals and organizations whose life-time or long-term achievements have made a significant impact upon the Central Texas community. Nominations may be made by completing and submitting the application as outlined in the next page of the “Guidelines.”

Selection Process:

Nominations for each award may be submitted by nonprofit organizations and individuals in the Central Texas Region. A nomination must be initiated in writing. Criteria for the nominations are listed below. Nominees must live or do business in the Central Texas Region. Completeness of information is essential for consideration. The Awards Committee will make a final selection for each award from among the nominees. All categories will be awarded having met the selection criteria and historical high standards of achievement. If, in the judgment of the Committee, no nominees meet the criteria, an award may not be given.

Presentation of Awards:

The honorees selected will receive their awards at the National Philanthropy Day Luncheon on November 14, 2019, and will be notified of their selection prior to the event. This year the luncheon will be held at the Pavilion at the Carleen Bright Arboretum at 11:30 a.m. Honorees must be present to receive the awards.

GUIDELINES

1. Send in your nomination on time. **Entries for all awards categories must be received NO LATER THAN 5:00 p.m., August 5, 2019.**
2. Complete the Nomination Form.
3. **Enumerate each criteria and address each one separately in narrative form.** Entries will be judged on each of the criteria. Narrative should contain complete, clear, concise answers to criteria. (Criteria for each category is outlined on pages 5-8.)
4. The narrative section should be no more than three (3) pages with 12 point font and 1 inch margins.
5. **Supporting documents are highly recommended and should enhance narrative and not be used instead of the narrative to answer the criteria. No more than 10 pages of supporting documents are allowed.** Nominations for Outstanding Business/Corporation may include an annual report in addition to the ten (10) pages. **No videos or electronic attachments will be accepted.**
6. Each nomination should include:
 - Nomination Form
 - Narrative of criteria
 - Supporting documents (optional, but highly recommended)
7. The application, if mailed, should be fastened together with a clip on the upper left corner. **Do not bind or send in notebooks or folders.**
8. Applications are the responsibility of the nominating organization. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
9. If you submitted a nomination last year that was not selected for an award (see list of awards at the end of this packet), your nomination will be included for review this year (one additional year only). You may submit additional information to supplement your nomination on file. Please indicate on a cover page which nomination it supplements and that it is an addition to last year's nomination.

AWARD CATEGORIES & CRITERIA

Lifetime Achievement Award

This award is presented to an individual, families, or organizations that demonstrate a lifetime record of exceptional generosity who, through direct financial support, have encouraged others to assume civic or charitable responsibility.

Nomination Packet Criteria:

1. Description of impact of gift support over a lifetime to what number of organizations. (0-30 points)
2. Description of outstanding philanthropic projects resulting from a gift or leadership. (0-20 points)
3. Description of charitable giving that has resulted in gifts by other individuals. (0-25 points)
4. Evidence of encouragement and motivation given to others to take leadership roles in philanthropy. (0-25 points)

Philanthropist of the Year

This award is presented to an individual or family with a proven record of exceptional generosity who, through direct financial support, has demonstrated outstanding civic and charitable responsibility, and whose generosity encourages others to take philanthropic leadership roles.

Nomination Packet Criteria:

1. Evidence of direct gift support. (0-30 points)
2. Description of impact of gift support. (0-20 points)
3. Evidence of encouragement and motivation given to others to take leadership roles in philanthropy. (0-25 points)
4. Description of participation in and gift support of other nonprofit organizations. (0-15 points)
5. Evidence of philanthropic support of innovative approaches to solving problems. (0-10 points)

Outstanding Philanthropic Business/Corporation Award

This award is presented to a business/corporation for outstanding commitment through financial or in-kind support. In addition, an Outstanding Business/Corporate Award will recognize a company that excels in motivating others to volunteer and takes a leadership role in philanthropy and community involvement beyond the monetary value of gifts.

Nomination Packet Criteria:

1. Evidence of direct gift support. (0-30 points)
2. Evidence of impact of gift support. (0-20 points)
3. Description of specific achievements accomplished through the organization's efforts. (0-25 points)
4. Evidence of encouragement and motivation given to others to take leadership roles in philanthropy and
5. community involvement. Evidence of support for employees as volunteers in the community. (0-15 points)
6. Evidence of philanthropic support of innovative approaches to solving problems. (0-10 points)

Outstanding Community Service Organization Award

This award is presented to a community service organization that demonstrates an outstanding commitment of philanthropic efforts through community involvement and/or financial or in-kind support. List your nominee's achievements including:

Nomination Packet Criteria:

1. Evidence of direct financial support and/or in-kind support of community projects. (0-20 points)
2. Description of the impact of organization's support on the local community. (0-20 points)
3. Evidence of membership volunteerism in support of philanthropic efforts and/or with the nonprofit sector. (0-25
4. points)
5. Description of specific achievements accomplished through the organization's efforts. (0-20 points)
6. Evidence of encouragement and motivation given to others to take leadership roles toward philanthropy and
7. community involvement. (0-15 points)

Outstanding Volunteer Fundraiser Award

This award is presented to an individual who has demonstrated exceptional leadership skills in coordinating groups of volunteers for major fundraising projects for more than one nonprofit organization. The recipient should demonstrate exceptional skills coordinating and motivating groups of volunteers for fundraising projects for the benefit of charitable institutions and a commitment to the advancement of philanthropy.

Nomination Packet Criteria:

1. Evidence of quality of leadership and organizational ability in fundraising campaigns. (0-30 points)
2. Description of time, effort, and financial commitment. (0-20 points)
3. Description of fundraising goals achieved by his/her efforts. (0-25 points)
4. Evidence of success in recruiting and motivating others. (0-15 points)
5. Description of participation in other community nonprofit organizations. (0-10 points)

Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award (age 5-18)

This award is presented to an individual of a group of young people ages 5 to 18 who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to the community through direct financial support, development of charitable programs, volunteering and leadership in philanthropy. This award emphasizes fundraising and philanthropy.

Nomination Packet Criteria:

1. Description in detail of what the nominee did, including goals, process, budget (if relevant) and other people involved in the process (adult leaders or adviser, e.g.) and of the time, talent and/or treasure the youth gave for the common good and the results that were achieved.(0-40 points)
2. Description of the impact the nominee had on the community, including numbers of people involved, financial impact, and organizations helped. Please include the names and contact information of individuals at the organizations who benefited from the nominee's work. (0-30 points)
3. Description of long term (1 to 2 years) impact of the nominee's work. Will the fundraising be ongoing and has the nominee considered the next steps or is working on other fundraising projects? (0-20 points)
4. Evidence that the fundraising can serve as a prototype for others or is easily replicable in other communities. (0-10 points)

Outstanding Fundraising Professional Award

This award is presented to an outstanding individual fundraising professional who practices his/her profession in an exemplary manner.

Nomination Packet Criteria:

1. Description of at least 8 years of professional experience, career achievements, and results. (0-25 points)
2. Evidence of quality of leadership that is effective, creative and stimulating, and that the individual acts as a team player. (0-20 points)
3. Evidence of membership in AFP and that the individual practices and promotes the AFP Code of Ethical Principles. (0-20 points)
4. Description of individual's commitment to continuing professional development, including certification (CFRE/ACFRE), conference participation, publication and professional education. (0-15 points)
5. Evidence of commitment of fundraising and philanthropy through voluntary services and financial support of nonprofit organizations. (0-20 points)

Outstanding Foundation Award

This award is presented to a foundation that demonstrates outstanding commitment through financial support, encouragement and motivation of others to take leadership roles in philanthropy and national, international and/or community involvement.

Nomination Packet Criteria:

1. Evidence of philanthropic support of innovative approaches to solving problems nationally and/or internationally. (0-45 points)
2. Description of impact of gift support and achievements accomplished through the foundation's efforts. (0-35 points)
3. Evidence of encouragement and motivation given to others to take leadership roles in philanthropy and community involvement. (0-20 points)
