Job description

- Work with the Executive Director and Board of Directors to develop and implement a comprehensive fundraising strategy including major gifts, grants, annual giving, planned giving and special events.
- Develop and execute both an annual and a long-term development plan for Samaritan Center. This plan will
 include crafting appropriate workflows and related budgets, as well as identifying metrics to gauge analysis of
 activity ultimately measuring progress and plan success
- Engage, solicit and expand/grow existing donors
- Identify, solicit, and engage prospective donors.
- Work collaboratively with development staff to manage the solicitation of annual gifts and sponsorships, develop fundraising opportunities, and coordinate fundraising events to meet or exceed annual fundraising goals.
- Work with Executive Director and Board of Directors to develop and implement a comprehensive marketing and communications plan.
- Work closely with the development staff to create solicitation materials, marketing materials, website and social media content, presentations and correspondence
- Provide staff support to Development, Marketing and Event Committees and other volunteer groups involved in fundraising.
- Work with administrative staff, development staff and volunteers to ensure the appropriate systems, staffing
 and procedures are in place to support fundraising goals, including the integrity of the customer management
 software.
- Supervise the work of development staff, providing professional expertise and direction in all aspects of fundraising.
