Perhaps it is the acronym that intimidates us. But in the most basic sense, a Donor Advised Fund (DAF) is just another "pocket" a donor might reach into when choosing to support your mission. While many donors give from their "income pocket": using cash, check or credit card, some donors give from their "wealth pocket": via stock, securities, or real estate. Still others choose to give from retirement savings with an IRA rollover or Qualified Charitable Distribution.

The Donor Advised Fund is a "pocket" specifically intended for charity.
