### **AWARD CATEGORIES**

#### **Outstanding Philanthropist Award**

This award is presented to an individual or family with a record of exceptional generosity who, through direct financial support, has demonstrated outstanding civic and charitable responsibility, and whose generosity encourages others to take philanthropic leadership roles on a local, national and/or international level. Nominations should include specific examples of direct financial support to nonprofit organizations, the impact of the gift support, special achievements and leadership taken to motivate and encourage others to give.

## James W. McLamore Outstanding Volunteer Award

This award is presented to a member of the local community who has demonstrated exceptional leadership skills in coordinating groups of volunteers in major fundraising projects and a commitment to the advancement of philanthropy. Nominations should include a description of the nominee's quality of leadership and organizational ability, the extent of their personal commitment in terms of time and effort, the financial results of their efforts, their success in recruiting and motivating others, and extent of their participation in and support for non-profit organizations throughout the community.

# Julia Tuttle Award for Community Involvement and Corporate Citizenship

(RECIPIENT MUST BE A GREATER MIAMI CHAMBER OF COMMERCE MEMBER)

This award is presented by the Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce to a corporation that operates its business in Miami-Dade County, but need not be headquartered here. Underwriting of special programs and events, cash contributions, in-kind gifts of goods and services, and time and service committed by its staff are key areas of community involvement. Nominations should include a description of the extent of financial contributions to nonprofit organizations, services rendered, and leadership.

#### **Outstanding Grant Maker Award**

This award is presented to a grant making organization that has made a significant impact with its grant funding in the previous year in support of nonprofit philanthropic organizations in Miami-Dade County. The grant-making organization need not be headquartered here. Nominations should include a description of the grant activity, the financial contributions and the difference that those contributions made to nonprofit organizations and throughout the community.

#### **Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award**

This award recognizes service by an individual ages 8-23 who demonstrate outstanding commitment to the community through direct financial support, development of charitable programs, volunteering and leadership in philanthropy. Nominations should include a description of the grant activity, the financial contributions and the difference that those contributions made to nonprofit organizations and throughout the community.

# 2022 AWARDS NOMINATION GUIDELINES

The Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) Miami Chapter in partnership with The Miami Foundation, Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce and the Partnership for Philanthropic Planning of Miami-Dade County invite nominations for the 35th Annual National Philanthropy Day awards.

The awards will be presented at the NPD Luncheon on Friday, November 4, 2022 to honor individuals, corporations, volunteers and grant makers whose remarkable vision, generosity, commitment, dedication, and talents have enhanced the strength and effectiveness of philanthropic endeavors in Miami-Dade County.

### Guidelines

- Award recipients must be present to accept the award at the 2022 National Philanthropy Day Luncheon on Friday, November 4, 2022.
- The Awards Selection Committee will not accept any nomination which substitutes resumes, newspaper articles, annual reports, etc. for concise response to the stated criteria. Letters of recommendation are accepted, but only at time of the original nomination submission.
- Posthumous nominations will not be accepted.
- The Awards Selection Committee is composed of: AFP Miami Chapter President, National Philanthropy Day Committee Chairperson, and representatives from each partnering organization. The Committee's decisions are final.
- All Miami-Dade nonprofit organizations are eligible to submit a nomination, but there will be special consideration of nominations provided by AFP Miami members.
- Lifetime achievement and Champion of Philanthropy awards are given at the discretion of the Awards Selection Committee and the AFP Miami Chapter.
- Nominees must make themselves available for a pre-event video.

## Nominee Information Required / Narrative Description

- •All nominations must include a description of the nominee's accomplishments, his/her distinguished service and commitment to the community.
- Impact on the nominator's organization including time, talent and treasure committed.
- Impact on other nonprofit organizations in Miami-Dade including time, talent and treasure committe.
- Any other awards/honors received.
- Any other information that makes the nominee worthy of the award for which he/she is being nominated.
- Other community members and/or organizations that would be likely to attend the NPD Awards Luncheon if the nominee is chosen to be honored.

The narrative description should not exceed two (2) pages.
