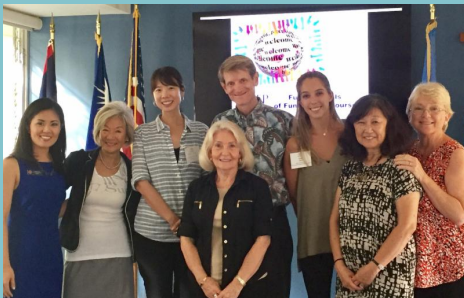

What's in an Annual Meeting?

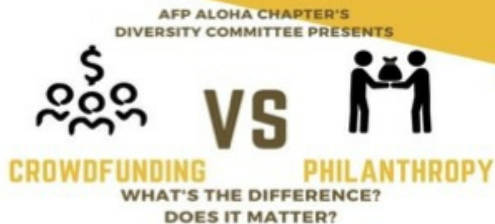


Our December 5th luncheon at The Willows Restaurant is designed for fun, networking, a fantastic speaker, prize giveaways...oh, and an annual meeting.
