You know that feeling on grant deadline day, when you finally push the submit button or deliver it to the post office, and you say goodbye to your mission-critical grant proposal as it disappears...vanishing for weeks, sometimes months, sometimes forever...as you wait to find out whether it's going to be funded or not.

That time between "submit" on one side...and "notification" on the other...is where all the work goes on for the grantmaking team—the program officer, reviewers, decision-makers. That's where everything happens to decide which proposals are awarded... and which aren't.



#### 7 Reasons to Join an AFP Aloha Chapter Committee


- **1) Experience:** You will get to experience how things work inside the Aloha Chapter and see what all goes into making the chapter tick.



<u>Take the CFRE exam from your home or office</u>: The CFRE exam can now come to you via online proctoring! At no additional cost, CFRE candidates have the option to take the CFRE exam without setting foot inside a testing center. <u>Learn more...</u>

Need continuing education points?: Whether you're on the lookout for continuing education points for your CFRE initial application or your recertification, don't forget that attending webinars counts. A one-hour webinar equals one continuing education point. Remember to save your webinar registration confirmation email or take a screenshot of the webinar's first and last slides for your records as proof of

attendance.

<u>Your volunteer time counts for education points!</u>: Whether you're working towards CFRE initial certification or recertification, your volunteering time can count towards the CFRE Education points requirements. This includes volunteering for schools and places of worship. Don't forget to add those points in the Service Learning section of your application.

### **AFP Job Listing and Policy**

#### **New Listing Requirement Effective November 1st**

Please be advised that AFP Global is requiring all job postings to include a salary range. AFP advises that the reasoning for the policy change is that by not including the salary range in a job posting/description, it can allow the hiring organization to offer different salaries depending on who the candidate is, thereby possibly reinforcing the gender and/or racial salary differences. This requirement will apply for all job postings beginning November 1, 2020.
