



AFP San Diego Statement in Response to Violent Attacks in Atlanta, GA

AFP San Diego stands in support of our Asian Pacific Islander Middle Eastern Desi American (APIMEDA) communities. We were deeply saddened by the recent tragedy that took place in Atlanta on Tuesday night; a violent hate crime that left eight people, including six Asian women, shot dead at three metropolitan establishments. We mourn the senseless and tragic loss of these lives and remain vigilant as attacks on APIMEDA communities have increased dramatically.
