POSITION SUMMARY

JFS CEO Michael Hopkins appointed visionary Chief Advancement Officer, Kea Spurrier, in 2020. Since joining the organization, she has been instrumental in shaping and scaling the next phase of their growth and impact which includes their first comprehensive campaign for which they are currently in the pre-campaign phase. Kea has worked in philanthropy for over 25 years raising funds for education, conservation, social services and social justice and has significantly grown JFS revenue during her tenure from \$32M to \$85M which includes an increase of individual giving/annual fund revenue growing from \$5.5M to \$13M. Kea fosters a diverse, equitable and inclusive culture of collaboration and partnership which is also a reflection of organizational values. The DoD will report to the Senior Director of Development, Individual Giving, Josh Lipsky. The Director of Development serves as a leader within the Development department and supports the organization's fundraising efforts and is responsible for building and managing a portfolio of donors and prospects who have the capacity to make a major blended gift in addition to an annual gift of at least \$25,000. The DoD is a member of a 6-person team collectively responsible for raising \$13M.

The Director of Development will be a compassionate, mission-driven individual responsible for raising support for JFS through prospect identification, donor and prospect cultivation, face-to-face meetings, written and virtual solicitations, proposals to individuals and foundations, and events. She/he/they will solicit blended gifts to support the annual fund, operating budget and the Endowment and will have a tremendous opportunity to build upon the momentum already established and be a part of this critical, meaningful work in a highly visible role for the organization.

JFS seeks an exceptional front-line fundraiser who demonstrates confidence, polish, and a natural ability to lead others. The ideal candidate should be someone who wants to join a dynamic team of professionals who embrace Jewish values and is excited to work on a major-gifts-driven campaign. She/he/they will have a unique opportunity to incorporate her/his/their diverse fundraising skills through direct solicitations.





The ideal candidate will have a successful track record as a self-starter cultivating and soliciting major gifts, excellent communication skills (both written and verbal) with prospects and donors, and a familiarity with the philanthropic community in San Diego. She/he/they will also possess a commitment to the mission of JFS and be energized by its vital contribution to building a stronger San Diego.

- Partner with the Chief Development Officer and Snr. Director of Development, Individual Giving to strengthen the major giving program.
- Serve as primary relationship manager for a portfolio of 120-150 donors and prospects.
- Develop and manage a portfolio of gift prospects at different stages of the development process; design and implement strategies for their identification, cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship.
- Collaborate with the Director of Planned Giving to help identify prospects for blended gift asks
- Pursue proactive prospect outreach, and further develop the planned giving program.
- Oversee and leverage fundraising events to expand the donor base, including the next generation of donors with major gift potential.
- Work strategically with volunteer leadership to encourage prospect identification and cultivation, and event participation.
- Develop and maintain a thorough understanding of JFS's fundraising priorities and pertinent information about JFS's strategic plan.
- Serve as an enthusiastic and well-informed spokesperson for JFS; continuously learn about their programs and developments and share them with selected donors and prospects.
