### **Job Summary**

The Prospect Researcher and Development Operations is a valuable member of the Segerstrom Center for the Arts Development team, contributing to an overall goal of \$14M+ annually. This position reports directly to the Associate Director of Development Operations and supports the team's fundraising efforts through prospect research, operational support, and data management with a specific emphasis on major gifts.

## **Primary Responsibilities\***

- Assist in the identification, research and distribution of qualified leads to help build and sustain a strong pipeline of prospects and donors.
- Utilize prospect research tools such as iWave, DonorSearch, Foundation Center and other online and print reference resources to conduct prospect analysis and confidential research profiles.
- Actively participate in the recording, updating and monitoring of donor/prospect research and identification as well as moves management.
- Lead regular prospecting, solicitation and cultivation meetings with frontline fundraisers.
- Create customized gueries as needed to support department.
- Maintain integrity of CRM database through updating records and reconciliation
