Alan Verbeke, President of Yukon Graphics has been actively involved with AFP-NJ since 1998 and a member of the organization since 2008. His introduction to AFP-NJ came by way of a customer and AFP-NJ member Paula Hunchar who, at the time, was the income development director at Morris Museum. Yukon Graphics became a Resource Partner at the 1998 Conference for Philanthropy and has continued his support for over 20 years. He spent 20 years on the Leadership Morris Alumni Council board, co-chairing it for four years, and is a graduate of both Leadership Morris and Leadership Somerset. He has also received the Boy Scouts Patriots Path Council, Morris County Lifetime Achievement Award.
