The University of Tennessee Foundation, Inc (UTFI) invites applications and nominations to fill the position of **Director of Development, College of Medicine** at the University of Tennessee Health Science Center (UTHSC) in Memphis, TN.

Reporting to the Executive Director of Development and in coordination with faculty leaders, the Director of Development will develop fundraising strategies to enhance relationships and advance the college's philanthropic priorities. Significant focus will be given to growing fundraising for scholarships, engagement for the College's Department of Medicine, as well as other key programs, and increasing grateful patient philanthropy opportunities.

In collaboration with the Executive Director, this position will develop a portfolio of new and current major giving prospects that align with priority areas and needs. The individual will build relationships through meaningful visits and discovery calls with current or potential donors, while identifying, cultivating, and stewarding donors and securing gifts for college initiatives. Additional responsibilities include building partnerships with faculty, engaging grateful patients, marketing strategies, professional writing, planning, developing correspondence, strategic communications and presentations, reporting, and other fundraising initiatives.

The ideal candidate will establish and maintain strong and effective relationships with UTHSC's major internal and external constituencies which include the Chancellor and his leadership team; the Executive Dean, Department Chairs, faculty, alumni, and community advocates of the College of Medicine; and members of related academic, administrative, research, and clinical programs including volunteers and alumni.

Required Education and Experience

The candidate who fills the Director of Development, College of Medicine position is required to have:

- Bachelor's degree
- 5+ years of experience in fundraising, sales, advancement, or marketing/communications
- Proven track record of demonstrated professional achievement
- A high level of motivation, initiative, flexibility, and creativity with ability to focus and prioritize building relationships & soliciting gifts
- Ability and willingness to travel

Note - Candidates holding a graduate degree must have at least 3 years of experience.

- Ability to work well in a team-oriented and social environment
- Strong communication skills to maintain effective interaction with important constituencies
- Salesforce experience
