(1) Check your digital access tools: (a) update your [zoom app](#); (b) for guaranteed browser effectiveness across the entire meeting, use [Chrome](#) or Firefox (other browsers work for some but not all events); and (c) note the time zone indicated with the scheduled event.

(2) Use the first week to enjoy extra plenary sessions and social events, and prepare for the 2nd week by tuning into pre-recorded talks and posters.

(3) Don't miss the EPSP Business Meeting with award presentations and responses from awardees. It is Thursday, 10 December at 1500 "Los Angeles time" and the Robert Sharp Lecture ([EP033](#)) to be given by the Leopold awardee immediately following (at 1600 Los Angeles time). This year we have 3 awards, including the new Marguerite T. Williams mid-career award, the Leopold early career award, and the Gilbert career award.
