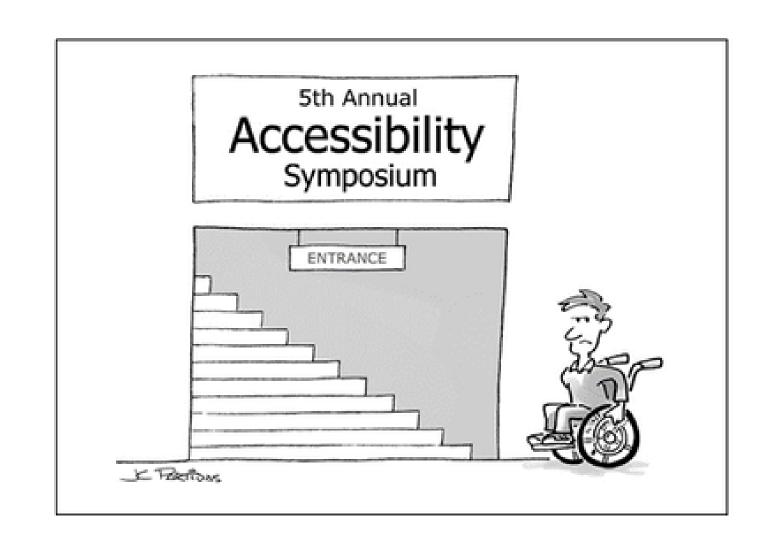

Each video is under 6 minutes in length & open-captioned.

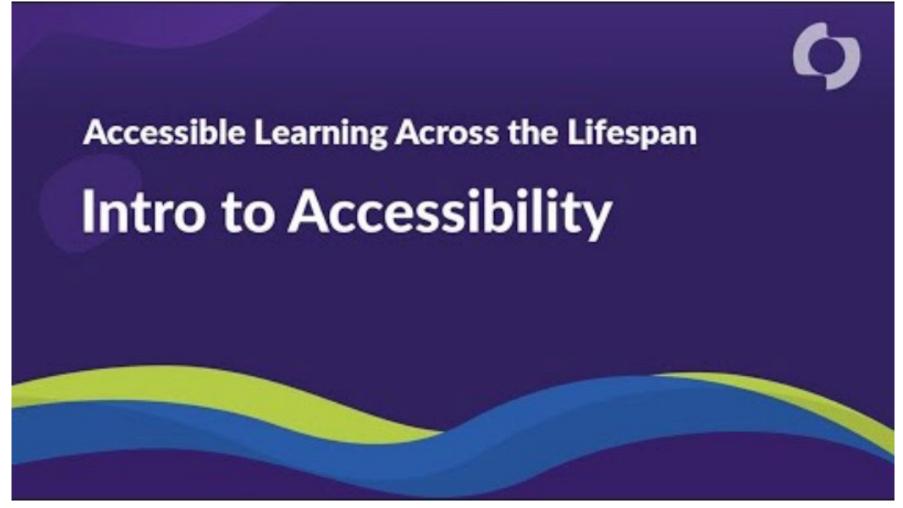
The United States Access Board
