The Dayton-Cincinnati Aerospace Science Symposium is designed to facilitate communication between members of the local technical community and provide a forum for sharpening technical presentation skills. All presentations will be limited to 20 minutes, including time for questions. **No written paper is required**, and works in development for other technical forums are welcome. The Symposium program will include up to eleven parallel sessions in the morning and afternoon, a luncheon, and a special **Keynote Addresses and Panel Discussion**, which will speak to **"Challenges for U.S. Military and Commercial Aviation in the Global Economy."** Panel members will include **Maj Gen Paul Nielsen (Commander, Air Force Research Laboratory), Mr. Bob May (Executive Director, Aeronautical Systems Center), and Richard Stanley (VP&GM, GEAE Engineering Division)**. The Dayton-Cincinnati Section of AIAA will confer a "Best Presentation" award for each technology area at the annual Section Awards Banquet in late Spring 2004. Attendees are encouraged to participate in the associated **Art-in-the-Science Competition** by submitting images that combine technical content and aesthetic appeal. This year, we feature a **Job Fair**, where local government and industry representatives will be available to discuss career and collaboration opportunities with you.

ABSTRACTS: *Abstracts must be submitted via our website at <http://www.aiaa-daycin.org>.* The website contains instructions and will acknowledge your submission by e-mail. Presentations are solicited in all general areas of aerospace S&T, including fluid dynamics, propulsion, materials, structures, controls and avionics, sensors, combustion and fuels, turbomachinery, and power. The total number of abstracts will be limited based on room availability; therefore, it is recommended that you submit titles immediately to reserve your space. This year the website will allow you to change or withdraw your abstract up to the deadline, so don't delay getting started.
