The Founder's Note

Beyond innovation: How transformative thinking can influence IT project management

Innovation has become management's new imperative, the word du jour; a buzz word for organizations and leaders. Everyone agrees that it is important. However, nobody can quite agree on what it actually is or what it means. Innovation is a concept that has existed since the origins of the human race More than five decades ago, famous marketing professor, Theodore Levitt wrote "Creativity Is Not Enough."

Today, the words of his title arguably resonate in distinct ways. The ubiquity of "innovation" and "creativity" in the language of business and management is threatening to empty them of meaning. Increasingly,

neither is sufficient to convey the vision, inspiration, aspiration, newness, value, and strategy that new technologies can deliver for a unit or firm. Our own literature in Project Management is replete with articles and blogs about innovation and creativity of PM. A quick search of google scholar results in 100s of articles and book chapters on this topic. We appear to have circumcised ourselves into "black boxes" dictated by PMBOK, AGILE, and PRINCE of today; rather than an incisive intellectual focus on truly understanding and formulating actionable solutions for the fundamental issues that drive projects towards failure.

SIGITProjMgmt was founded with the idea that we will drive and stimulate research, education and the practice of IT Project Management (ITPM). We need forward thinking regarding the challenges and opportunities in ITPM and foster a mindset that goes beyond innovation.

I propose that we think transformatively about what the future of IT project management will look like. Because of its systemic and interdisciplinary nature, transformational thinking about ITPM requires from its practitioners a high level of commitment and skill in collaboration across disciplines. Transformational thinking about ITPM requires that we use a holistic approach to evaluating the challenges of project management, deriving power by attending equally (or internationally) to human behavior, social systems, emerging technologies, and structures in which projects exist. This will take a multi-disciplinary perspective, integrating a range of approaches and research methodologies. By dealing with all elements of human systems, a transformational ITPM perspective should be irreversible and enduring in its impact on the phenomenon and field. All facets of ITPM in this context need investigation as something emergent rather than an outcome in the form of project success and other similar metrics.
