Submissions:

All papers must be original and not simultaneously submitted to another conference or journal. Submissions may be in the form of one or more of the following: completed research papers and research-in-progress papers.

Abstracts of accepted papers will appear in the electronic conference proceedings, available from AIS eLibrary. The authors retain the copyright to their work. At least one author must register for and present at the conference. High-quality submissions will be considered for two Best Paper awards, sharing \$1,000 in total.

Submission Template:

Submission Types:

- Completed Research: Completed research papers should be no more than 2,500 words, including all materials and sections such as figures, tables, and references.
- Research-in-Progress: Research-in-progress proposals (extended abstracts) or a summary of tentative results of the study to date of 500-1000 words.
