SUMMARY

The Core Publications Coordination Committee coordinates the publishing and information dissemination activities of the division through the Monographs Editorial Board, the Library Materials Price Index (LMPI) Editorial Board, and the Editorial Boards of the three Core Journals: Information Technology & Libraries (ITAL), Library Leadership & Management (LL&M), and Library Resources & Technical Services (LRTS). This report includes a summary of work completed by the committee and the five editorial boards from July 2023 to June 2024, including the table of contents from each journal issue published, monographs under contract, and recent monograph sales. Additional activities of each editorial board have been reported through the Core Committee Report Form in December 2023 and May 2024.

GENERATIVE AI POLICY

The Core Journal Editors developed a Policy on the Use of Generative AI by Authors and Reviewers. This policy had input from all three journal editorial boards, the Core Publications Coordination Committee, and the Core Board. The Publications Committee finalized and approved the policy on June 10, 2024. The approved policy can be found in an additional document submitted with this report.

POST-PUBLICATION CONCERNS POLICY

The Core Journal Editors developed a Post-Publication Concerns Policy. This policy had input from all three journal editorial boards, the Core Publications Coordination Committee, and the Core Board. The Publications Committee finalized and approved the policy on June 10, 2024. The approved policy can be found in an additional document submitted with this report.

LABOR OF PEER REVIEW RECOMMENDATION

The Publications Coordination Committee, journal editorial boards, and Core Board have had discussions about recognizing the labor of peer review. While no decisions have been made regarding this yet, a

summary of this work is included below. The Publications Committee plans on continuing to discuss this in the upcoming year.

The topic of recognizing the labor of peer review came up in a LRTS Editorial Board meeting. A potential reviewer declined because they only practice open peer review. Editorial board members discussed the value of open peer review and agreed that one is in valuing and making visible the labor of peer reviewers.

Editors of all Core journals are occasionally asked for documentation or acknowledgement of peer review (for evaluation, promotion, tenure, etc.). This has been done through letters or emails and upon request only.

Given the strategic focus on [Career Building and Recognition](#), the Core journal editors wondered how and if a more systematic approach might be appropriate. Here are some approaches taken by other LIS journals:

1. Several register peer review activities through Publons.
 - A. *EBLIP*, which uses OJS, adds this language to peer review acknowledgement emails: "Thank you for completing the review of the submission, [article name] for Evidence Based Library and Information Practice. We appreciate your contribution to the quality of the work that we publish.
If you have an account with Publons (<https://publons.com/>), you may forward this acknowledgement to reviews@publons.com in order to have it added to your pre-publication peer review record."
 - B. Taylor & Francis journals (which use Editorial Manager) seem to have a direct connection to Publons. Reviewers indicate whether or not they want credit for their review and depending on that preference, the review appears in Publons.
2. Some journals or programs issue certifications or other forms of recognition. The Library Writing Cooperative offers a formal letter of recognition and offers to recognize reviewers in its First Draft Matchmaker program on its [webpage](#).
3. Some journals publish open peer reviews, for example: [The academic, economic and societal impacts of Open... | F1000Research](#)

OA JOURNAL FUNDRAISING

The Core Journal Editors worked with EBSCO and Harrassowitz to create a package that libraries can subscribe to in order to provide funding to Core to help support the open access journals. Once the packages with the two vendors was set-up, this project was passed over the Core staff to advertise and accept funding as it came in from the two vendors. We are hoping that this will be advertised by Core soon so that libraries can choose to subscribe to this package.

The Publications Coordination Committee has also had conversations on other methods for generating funding to help support the open access journals. The Core Fundraising and Sponsorship Committee added an option for vendors to sponsor a journal for \$6000 annually. The journal editors have some concern with this since it could be viewed as a conflict of interest having a vendor sponsor a journal while the content of the journal could include information about that vendor. The editorial boards will be discussing this soon to provide feedback to the Fundraising Committee. There may be a recommendation to change this to an advertisement rather than a sponsorship. More information will be shared with the Fundraising Committee soon.

COPE RECOMMENDATION TO ALA COUNCIL

Rachel Scott and Ken Varnum have represented Core on an ALA Publishing Committee discussing recommendations based on the COPE Principles from the Committee on Publishing Ethics. This report was delivered to ALA Council on June 7, 2024 and will be open for public review and comment soon.

LIBRARY MATERIALS PRICE INDEX (LMPI)

In October 2023, the Library Materials Price Index Editorial Board officially became part of the Core Publications Coordination Committee. A webpage for the committee (<https://www.ala.org/core/member-center/committees/lmpi-editorial-board>) and an ALA Connect space were created. Sylvia Orner, LMPI Editor, was added to the Publications Coordination Committee. The work of this editorial board is mainly concentrated in the early part of each year after the previous year's publication data is available. The index for 2024 has been submitted to InfoToday.com and is awaiting publication.
