AGS Research Consortium (ARC) – A program that provides a funding source to support AGS sponsored clinical trial research designed to optimize glaucoma care, and to develop a web portal where de-identified data can be shared with AGS members.

Young Clinician Scientists Awards — Encourages the development of young clinician scientists in glaucoma by providing funding for research projects within the first 5 years after graduation, a time period critical for developing the skills necessary for a research career and establishing a track record of productivity.
