Section-Supported Journals

ASA is adopting a cafeteria membership plan for its members. As a result, the way ASA will be handling subscriptions for Survey Methodology and the Journal of Official Statistics (JOS) will be changing.

The Section, in order to encourage wider use of these valuable resources, is exploring offering SRM members a one-time \$5 discount per journal, for a one-year subscription to either JOS or Survey Methodology or both. Details will be announced in the SRM column in Amstat News.

### Membership



Section membership was 1,400 as of June 30, 1993. That is up considerably from last December. A newly designed Section brochure and New Member Survey were sent out to the 66 members who joined the Section in the first quarter of 1993. A letter and follow-up survey were also sent to 53 people who dropped their Section membership during that time. One of the results of these surveys was to start this newsletter on a trial basis. ### Certification

### **Treasury Report**

As of June 30, 1993, the balance in the treasury was \$37,155.19. This balance will increase with revenues from the Proceedings. At least \$3,000 advanced to help co-sponsor the International Conference on Establishment Surveys is also expected to be re-imbursed. \$500 will be deducted for the Section's sponsorship of Survey Research. Suggestions are needed on initiatives to take advantage of this new revenue, including possibly producing an SRM newsletter.

#### **Council of Sections**

The Council informed Sections that ASA is considering collecting \$2 per member, instead of \$1 per member, in order to help pay for services to the Sections. That would certainly impact on Section dues, which currently stand at \$2.

ASA has also asked if the Sections would be willing to offer a free year's membership in their Section to new members, as an incentive to joining ASA. New members coming up for renewal would then see the Section listed on their renewal notice, which might increase Section registration in the long run. (David Binder and Mary Mulry are our representatives.)

### San Francisco Program

This Section's program featured over 200 SRM papers; 6 invited paper sessions ("Multiple Views about Multiple Imputation" won in competition with other sections), 7 topic contributed paper sessions, 24 regular contributed paper sessions, 9 round table sessions and 7 poster sessions.

#### **Toronto Program**

Seven invited paper sessions have been proposed for next year. The proposals are:

- Exploring Fundamental Change: the 1995 Test Census;
- Establishment Surveys: Where Are They Now? Where Are They Going? Reflections on the International Conference on Establishment Surveys;
- Supercensus/Censusplus: Integrated Coverage Measurement for the 2000 Census;
- Evaluating the Effects of Methodological Change on Labor Force Estimates from the Current Population Survey;
- The Consumer Expenditure Survey: Income Reporting --Problems and Options;
- a Rao-Bellhouse-Sarndal session, co-sponsored with the Statistical Society of Canada; and
- Alternative Methods for the 2000 Census: National Academy of Sciences Panel.

## **Establishment Survey Conference**

SRM co-sponsored the International Conference on Establishment Surveys in Buffalo on June 27-30, 1993. Over 400 people registered for the meeting. A monograph volume will be published by John Wiley & Sons; a *Proceedings*, which will contain the contributed papers, is also planned. ## **Upcoming Conferences**

An International Conference on Survey Measurement and Process Quality is in the early planning stages. Tentative plans are to hold the conference in Bristol, U.K., April 1-4, 1995. Monograph papers are currently being sought on Design and Specification, Data Collection, Post-Survey Processing and Operations, Quality Assessment and Control, and Error Effects on Estimation,

Analyses, and Interpretation. (For information, contact Lars Lyberg.)

There is also interest in planning an International Conference on Computer-Assisted Survey Information Collection (CASIC), to be held in 1996. Anyone interested in this project should contact July Lessler. Still other conference ideas have been suggested, including possibly on foundation issues in sampling. Your ideas are welcome. # **Continuing Education**



The Section co-sponsored a short course on Applied Survey Data Analysis Methods (Rick Williams) with the Washington Statistical Society. SRM received \$3,029.26 as its share of the profits.

Section short courses for both the Winter Conference and the Joint Statistical Meetings have been less successful. Four proposals were made to CE, of which 3 were accepted, but all have been cancelled due to low registration prior to the meetings. SRM is exploring ways to get around the required 35 registration minimum, in order to keep the courses on the program.

Proposals for the Toronto meeting include: Random Digit Dialing Telephone Sampling Methods, a half-day course by Joe Waksberg and Michael Brick; and Introduction to Questionnaire Design, a one-day course by Nora Cate Schaeffer. Feedback from

#### Section Publications



The 1992 ASA *Proceedings* are now available. The 1993 *Proceedings* will contain 14 papers from the ASA Winter Conference, close to 200 from the Joint Statistical Meetings, and as many as 56 survey methods papers from the 1993 AAPOR meetings -- a 2-volume set of an estimated 1500 pages! For this year, SRM will continue to cost-share publication of the *Proceedings* with ASA, though we may want to reconsider this in the future.

The Section has been using the Amstat News to publish Section news. In addition, the column will feature a series of articles on lesser-known large scale samples and surveys. Contact Elizabeth Stasny by e-mail at eas @mps.ohio. state.edu.
