The Jeanne E. Griffith Mentoring Award was established in her honor in 2002. The award recognizes and encourages the mentoring of junior staff in the statistical community in federal, state, or local government.

Dr Monserrat Garcia-Closas (Deputy Director, DCEG, NCI) a world-renowned leader in cancer research with focus on risk prediction for breast cancer was chosen for her exemplary mentoring at all levels from entry level researchers to branch chiefs and for leveraging her leadership position to create opportunities for next generation of federal quantitative scientists in emerging areas of cloud computing and artificial intelligence.

Dr Barry Graubard (Senior Investigator, Biostatistics Branch, NCI) was chosen for his sustained and dedicated efforts throughout his tenure in federal government in developing the careers of statistics students and early career statistical researchers across federal government and academia.

STUDENT PAPER COMPETITION

APPLY NOW

Jointly sponsored by Government Statistics Section (GSS), Section on Social Statistics (SSS), and Survey Research Methods Section (SRMS)

Eligibility:

To be eligible to participate, you must be a current undergraduate or graduate student at any level, or a recent 2022 graduate who wishes to present research that was conducted as a student. Previous student paper competition winners will not be eligible for this award.

Papers entered in this competition must involve either a new statistical methodology or a creative application of statistical analyses to a problem, issue, or policy question pertinent to the subject areas of one of the sponsoring sections. The research does not have to be complete, but competitors must be able to submit an abstract prospectus that describes the planned research and nature of the intended innovation(s).

More than twelve sections of ASA sponsor Student Paper Competition / Travel Awards to assist students with travel expenses to attend JSM. Students may submit papers to no more than two competitions and may accept only one section's award. Students must inform all sections applied to when s/he wins and accepts an award, thereby removing the student from the award competition for the other section.

STUDENT PAPER COMPETITION (Cont.)

Application Process:

Applications must include: 1) cover letter with the applicant's name, current affiliation and status, and contact information (address, telephone, email); 2) abstract (300 words maximum); 3) draft paper (if available); or otherwise a 3 -page research prospectus; 4) letter from their adviser that certifies the applicant's status (e.g., current student or new graduate who completed the degree within the past year), and describes plans to complete the research.

To apply, please email the package containing the first three items above (the adviser letter should be sent separately by the adviser) to all the 2023 section officers listed below:

Deadlines:

- Applicants email the application package to the three program chairs-elect by 11:59 p.m. EST on December 15, 2022.
- Competition winners are notified by January 15, 2023.
- Competition winners must confirm their acceptance of the award, and immediately inform other sections that they applied to by January 20, 2023. Failure to confirm the award may lead to removal from the list of winners.
- Competition winners submit their winning paper abstract through the regular JSM abstract submission process by February 1, 2023.
