2019 Pat Doyle Awardee: Shelly Martinez, OMB

Shelly was the primary force behind the legislation that formed the Commission on Evidence Based Policymaking, served as the Executive Director for the Commission, played a major role in seeing the Commission's report to fruition, and had a significant role in promoting the legislation that resulted in the Foundations of Evidence-Based Policymaking Act of 2018. Shelly's key role in these activities make her a deserving recipient of the 2019 Doyle Award.

Jeanne E Griffith Mentoring Award – recognizes and encourages the mentoring of junior staff in the statistical community in federal, state, or local government.

2019 Griffith Awardee: **Sharon Boivin**, National Center for Education Statistics Although Sharon's permanent home is at NCES, her talent as a mentor evidenced itself within NCES, and also in recent assignments to the Commission on Evidence-based Policymaking and OMB's work on creating a Federal Data Strategy. Virtual Workshop Professional Development This fall, GSS and SSS are organizing a series of FREE virtual workshops on Usage of Blended Data and Combining Alternative Source Data: Methods, Challenges, and Considerations in the Era of Big Data as part of the ASA's Professional Development (PD) Series.
