

## 3RD IMPACT SYMPOSIUM: ADVANCES IN CLINICAL TRIAL STATISTICS: MULTIPLICITY ADJUSTMENT AND SEQUENTIAL, MULTIPLE ASSIGNMENT RANDOMIZED TRIALS

IMPACT, the Innovative Methods Program for Advancing Clinical Trials, the entity supported in part by a joint UNC-Chapel Hill-Duke-NC State P01 Program Project grant, is sponsoring a symposium entitled *Advances in Clinical Trial Statistics: Multiplicity Adjustment and Sequential, Multiple Assignment, Randomized Trials* on November 20-21, 2014, at the Embassy Suites Raleigh-Durham/Research Triangle in Cary, NC. The two-day symposium will consist of an interdisciplinary series of presentations centered around two main themes: Multiplicity adjustment in clinical trials and the emerging use of Sequential, Multiple Assignment, Randomized Trials (SMARTs) for personalized medicine discovery. Biostatisticians and clinical scientists will describe recent advances in these two areas, ranging from practical aspects to methodological developments.

A tutorial will lead off the portion of the program devoted to each theme, followed by two scientific sessions and two keynote lectures by leading researchers in each area. On the first day, a poster session featuring presentations from both areas will be held.

Keynote speakers include Yoav Benjamini, Ajit Tamhane, Susan Murphy, and Peter Thall.

This symposium will be of interest to clinical trial practitioners in industry and academia as well as others who have interest in recent and future directions in clinical trials and personalized medicine. The symposium honors the late Yosef Hochberg, a graduate of the Department of Biostatistics at UNC-CH who made fundamental contributions in the area of multiple testing procedures.

## 2014 AISC Conference

North Carolina Chapter of ASA and UNC Greensboro will host the International Conference on Advances in Interdisciplinary Statistics and Combinatorics (AISC – 2014) during October 10-12, 2014 at the UNC Greensboro campus. It is the third international conference organized by NC-ASA. The main objective of the conference is to promote interdisciplinary research involving statistical techniques by bringing together nationally and internationally recognized researchers from a wide range of disciplines. The common thread will be statistical methods used in their respective research programs. Women and minority candidates are especially encouraged to come to the conference.

The conference runs Oct 12-14 and opens with two workshops for students. The topics are Mathematical Biology/Game Theory & Big Data/Machine Learning. Principal speakers for the workshops are Mark Broom (City University London), Ross Cressman (Duke), David Dunson (Duke), Sudipto Guha (U. Penn), Vlastimil Krivan (South Bohemia, Chech), Lexin Li (N C State), Mike Mesterton-Gibbons (Florida State), Sayan Mukherjee (Duke), Jerry Reiter (Duke), and Ming Yuan (Wisconsin-Madison).
