

### **NC ASA SPEED MENTORING**

- A chance to informally and quickly connect with several other professionals in an informal, small group setting
- Activities derived from professional mentoring programs
- Event featured several established statisticians from our community and a dozen student and early-career mentees



### **SPEED MENTORING LOGISTICS**

- NC ASA President asked Mentors; provided bios online
- Participants applied by emailing one paragraph on interests – in part for matching
- Mentees matched with Mentor ahead of time
- Speed rounds everyone meets everyone
- Provided participant names/bios, example questions, etc
- Hosted in meeting room w/ refreshments


