International Year of Statistics



NV-ASA K-12 Poster Competition

The 9th annual NV-ASA K-12 Poster Competition took place this year. First, Second, Third Place, and two Honorable Mention awards were made in each of four grade categories (K-3, 4-6, 7-9, and 10-12). These State winning posters were all forwarded to the national competition. 407 posters prepared by 630 students at 23 schools were submitted for our competition. All of the


Once again, NV students have been prominent among the winners of the ASA National Statistics Poster Competition, with two of our posters receiving First Place and two receiving Second Place in their divisions. The posters winning these national awards are the following.

Carson McCue: *Dunkin' Data – What are the Most Popular Dunkin' Donuts?* Carson was in the 3rd grade at the Alexander Dawson School at Rainbow Mountain, Las Vegas; his poster won Honorable Mention in our



NV-ASA competition and First Place nationally in the K-3 Category. This is Carson's second national award.

Brandon Waters: *Is the Lady Young or Old?* Brandon was a 6th grader at the Hyde Park Middle School in Las Vegas. His poster won First Place in both our NV-ASA competition and the national competition in the 4-6 category.





Josephine Ruggieri: *Would You Make the Switch?* Josephine was a 5th grader at Eileen Conners Elementary School in Las Vegas. Her poster won second place in both our NV-ASA competition and the national competition in the 4-6 category.

Owen Steward: *A Color-Full First Impression*. Owen was a 12th grader at the Ed W. Clark High School in Las Vegas. His poster won second place in both our NV-ASA competition and the national competition in the 10-12 category.

We are proud of all of our NV-ASA winners and entrants and their teachers and sponsors. We're hoping for even more enthusiastic entries and participation in our 10th year.

Our 2012 Annual Meeting was held Saturday, October 6, 2012 in Las Vegas, marking the 10th anniversary of the Chapter. The keynote speaker was **Ron Wasserstein**, National ASA Executive Director. His presentation, titled was "Live! From the ASA", including discussions of educational and advocacy efforts, accreditation, meetings, publications, International Year of Statistics, and the 175th Anniversary of the American Statistical Association.

In addition, Jay Shen, Professor in the Department of Healthcare Administration and Policy of the School of Community Health Sciences at UNLV, spoke on "Applications of Statistical Methods in Health Services and Policy Research"; Anna Panorska, Professor and Graduate Director in the Mathematics and Statistics Department at UNR, spoke on "Testing Exponentiality vs Pareto Distribution via Likelihood Ratio"; Deb Stiver, of the UNR Department of Economics, spoke on "Working in Developing Countries: Sampling and Data Collection Issues"; and Charles Davis, Principal Statistician of EnviroStat and Visiting Associate Professor in the Department of Mathematical Sciences at UNLV, spoke on "Quasi-Non-Parametric Upper Tolerance Limits Occupational for Exposure Evaluations". ©

Jessica Jaynes is joining the Department of Mathematical Sciences of UNLV as Assistant Professor. She comes from UCLA. Her research interests are in applied statistics, discrete choice experiments, and experimental design.

Kyle Bradford is joining the Department of Mathematics and Statistics of UNR as a post-doctoral research fellow. He comes from Oregon State U; he is particularly interested in studying the mixing times of Markov processes.

Du Feng joined the UNLV School of Nursing this past summer as Full Professor of Biostatistics. ₩

The UNLV Mathematical Sciences Department maintains an active statistics seminar series, typically meeting on Fridays at 11:00-12:00 every few weeks during the academic year. Notices are sent to those on the NV-ASA email list.

The first seminar of the 2013-2014 academic year will take place Friday, September 13 11:00-12:00 in CBC-C114. Daniel Jeske of the Dept of Statistics, U Cal-Riverside will speak on "Neutral Zone Classifiers and Their Applications". Neutral zone classifiers allow for a region of neutrality when there is inadequate information to assign a predicted class with suitable confidence. In this talk, Bayes neutral zone classifiers will be discussed and compared with previous neutral zone classifiers; extensions to sequential neutral zone classification will also be discussed.
