We've greeted a new year and it's now February. Plans are well underway for the 2015 Joint Statistical Meetings (JSM) to be held this August in Seattle, Washington. In fact, the deadline for submitting papers, panels and posters at this ASA-sponsored convention has



already passed! If you've never been to the national convention, consider attending this year since it's being held at a west coast location. JSM is the premier event for all things statistical and offers a wide range of activities useful for the practitioner, consultant, academic, or student. General registration for this event (available at www.amstat.org) begins in April. Nevada chapter current and past members try to get together for a group lunch or dinner, so let us know if you'll be attending. The get-together is always planned "impromptu" during week.

Our NV-ASA chapter is planning statewide activities for the 2015 year. Our functions often take place on the campuses of UNR and UNLV, and events are open to all. We encourage participation regardless of your position or statistical interest. The southern region offers periodic seminars, sometimes at dinner or weekend meetings, and at least two activities are being discussed as I write this message. In the north, plans are underway to present a session on "Careers in Statistics". ASA "Career Days" are a staple outreach activity of its chapters. Attendees can see the diversity of statistical careers and applications by listening to professionals discuss how they apply concepts and techniques in their employment and/or research. Our Annual Meeting is statewide; our custom of our chapter is to alternate its location between the south and the north. In October, the Annual Meeting, joined to a Fall Symposium, will take place at the University of Nevada, Reno. The meeting usually ends with a group dinner at one of Reno's fun restaurants. Be sure to check the NV-ASA website for the event announcements and updates.

NV-ASA K-12 Poster Competition

Our Fall Symposium took place Saturday, October 18, on the campus of UNLV. The keynote talk was given by Dr. Javier Rojo, the new Chair of the Department of Mathematics and Statistics of UNR. He spoke on "Body Mass Index. Obesity. Haseman-Elston, Orders by Dispersion,



and Estimation Under Constraints", featuring statistical models related involving obesity, genetic linkage, and type II diabetes risk.

The afternoon session featured a round-table discussion prompted by the article "P values, the 'gold standard' of statistical validity, are not as reliable as many scientists assume." by Regina Nuzzo (Nature v. 506, 13 February 2014, 150-152). We learned that in at least one field (epidemiology) scientific articles that used P-values were for a time automatically rejected by the editor! We were also (re-)introduced to such terms as P-hacking, data torturing, statistician shopping, and publication bias. Sharang Chaudhry (UNLV DMS) discussed the (non-Bayesian?) nature of the distributions of P-values. Chad Cross (Veterans Administration biostatistician, among other interests) told us about some of the things that actually go on between the time a study is designed and its results are prepared for submission for publication, as well as how results (including P-values and estimated effect sizes) are often interpreted. And Charles Davis (EnviroStat) discussed the opposite sort of situation, where the customer really wants to avoid statistically significant results; he also introduced ideas of multiple comparisons (how many tests did you run before finding a "significant" result?).





The presenters hope to continue these discussions at a meeting sometime this Spring. Remaining topics include dealing with multiple comparison issues in really big data settings, discussing data mining issues and introducing the recently invented <u>False Discovery Rate</u>, for example.

Mihye Ahn, Assistant Professor, coming to UNR from the University of North Carolina. Dr. Ahn's research interests are in variable selection, time series analysis, and linear mixed models.

Paul Hurtado, Assistant Professor, previously at the Mathematical Biosciences Institute and Aquatic Environment Laboratory of the Ohio State University. His research integrates techniques from the fields of dynamical systems, stochastic processes and statistics to develop and analyze mathematical models motivated by questions in population ecology, infectious disease and immunology.

Deena Schmidt, Assistant Professor, coming most recently from Case Western Reserve University. Her research interests are in mathematical biology, applied probability, neural networks, and population and evolutionary genetics, with particular interest in developing and analyzing mathematical models to understand the roles of stochasticity, structure, and evolution in shaping the dynamics of biological systems.

Raul Rojas, Visiting Professor. Dr. Roja's homepage identifies him as a Professor of Artificial Intelligence in the Department of Mathematics and Computer Science of the Free University of Berlin, and describes various projects in robotics, neural networks, and even automated mathematical formula recognition.
