\*


Our annual K-12 Statistics Poster Competition was held again this year under the leadership of Tia Maria Price, math teacher at Durango High School. Grade categories are K-3, 4-6, 7-9, and 10-12. First, Second, and Third prizes are awarded in every category when possible, along with Honorable Mentions as appropriate. All recognized posters have been forwarded to the National ASA Competition. A total of 219 posters were judged March 15-16, submitted by 362 students from 18 schools.

We thank the Southern Nevada Mathematics Council for their generous support of this competition, and we thank all those who participated in organizing and judging the competition.





























UNR announces a new graduate program: MS in Statistics and Data Science, to start in fall 2019. The MS program complements our PhD program in Statistics and Data Science and rounds up UNRs graduate curriculum in Statistics. This program has an applied flavor and is designed for those interested in industry work as well as PhD students in other areas of science who need to hone their statistics skills. Dr. Hojin Yang will join the Department of Mathematics and Statistics at UNR in July. He received his PhD degree in Biostatistics from University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 2016. Since then he has been a postdoctoral fellow at the University



of Texas, MD Anderson Cancer Center. His research interests include functional data analysis, high dimensional inference, and statistical machine learning.

Only a minority of the people who receive this newsletter are members of the Nevada Chapter of the American Statistical Association (NV-ASA). Dues are nominal.
