#### Northern Illinois Statistics Workshop

Minutes of October 28, 1983 Meeting at G.D. Searle & Co.

The purpose of the meeting was to learn about the plans of the Chicago Chapter (C.C.) Task Force concerning the "integration" of NISW into the Chapter.

Apparently Donna has been having a great deal of difficulty in putting together Task Force. To date it consists of two personsincluding Donna.

Donna expressed the distress of the C.C. over our intention to become a separate chapter. They are very willing to go as far as necessary to meet the need of all statistical disciplines. She suggested forming a working group of C.C., NISW, and general members.

She re-interated the general direction of support: (1) formal subgroup with some type of formal representation and a monetary arrangement or (2) umbrella organization supporting Chapter-wide functions. Paul vonDoehren informed her that the formal subgroup arrangement was unacceptable; only an umbrella organization was acceptable.

No further plan was presented by the C.C. members.

A changed in the C.C. Constitution requires a quorum by mail ballot. Thirty percent of the membership must return the ballot within 1 month and 2/3 of those must approve the change. Donna told us about the need for repeated balloting in order to get the necessary 30% response to correct typos in their Constitution.

Several times during the discussion the issue of workshops and conferences came up. Interaction on these programs seems to be a major, if not the major, interest of the C.C. Board. Donna felt that these programs would not function as successfully if the representatives from C.C. and NISW were not in the same Chapter.i.e, she did not believe a working committee composed of members from each chapter would function as well.

The importance of the timeframe in which the Task Force could work was stressed by NISW members. Originally, before Paul vonDoehren gave them draft copies of the NIC Constitution and By-Laws, Donna felt a draft Constitution could be brought before the C.C. Board of Directors in February. With the NIC draft to work from, the presentation could be moved up. (Donna, however, will have limited time to work on this in the coming months). The Board then would have to approve it and a special mail ballot sent to the membership. Presumably they (C.C.) would want this resolved by March so they can begin the nomination process for the next year's officers as in presently done. (See attached copy of C.C. Constitution).

Donna will be given up to 10 minutes on November 3 to discuss the C.C. proposal. She and Jennifer will be attending the luncheon but will not stay for the presentations.

#### CONSTITUTION

## Chicago Chapter, American Statistical Association (As amended in April, 1981)

#### Article 1, Name

The name of this organization shall be the Chicago Chapter of the American Statistical Association.

#### Article 2, Objectives

The objectives of the Chicago Chapter of the American Statistical Association shall be to foster interest in the improvement of statistical methods and in their useful applications, to promote unity and effectiveness of effort among all concerned with statistical problems, and to increase the contribution of statistics to human welfare. To this end, the Chapter proposes to conduct meetings; to produce publications; to make available information concerning statistical science; to cooperate with other organizations in the advancement of statistics; to stimulate research and promote high professional standards; and, in general, to make statistics of service to other sciences and to practical affairs.

## Article 3, Membership

The membership of the Chapter shall consist of persons who have paid the Chapter such dues as may be required and (a) who are members of the American Statistical Association or (b) who are otherwise interested in the objectives of the Chapter.

## Article 4, Affiliation

This Chapter shall maintain itself in good standing as a local chapter chartered by the American Statistical Association. A copy of this Chapter's Constitution, together with all subsequent amendments, shall be filed with the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Statistical Association. This Chapter shall be represented on the District Committee of the American Statistical Association in its area by its President and any other representative required by the National Constitution. No individual shall serve as this Chapter's representative for more than three successive years.

#### Article 5, Board of Directors

Members. There shall be a Board of Directors of this Chapter, which shall consist of the President, the President-Elect, the Vice-Presidents, the Secretary, the Treasurer, and eight additional Directors of whom seven shall be elected and the other shall be ex-officio. The ex-officio Director shall be the immediate Past President or one of the immediate Past Vice-Presidents. In addition, the North Central District Representative of the American Statistical Association, if a member of the Chicago Chapter, or the senior in terms of service as a District Representative if both are Chapter members, may serve as an ex-officio Director. The ex-officio members of the Board shall enjoy the same status as the other members of the Board.

Meetings. The Board of Directors shall meet at least once a year. Meetings shall be held at the call of the President or on written petition signed by three members of the Board.

<u>Powers and Duties</u>. The Board of Directors shall have power to administer the affairs of the Chapter in accord with policies adopted by itself or by the members of the Chapter; to recommend to the Chapter policies and action which will promote the welfare of the profession; to elect Honorary Members of the Chapter; to fix time and place of meetings of the Chapter; to administer the budget; and to discharge such other responsibilities as may be required for the successful operation of the Chapter. They shall also have the power to change the By-Laws by a three-quarter vote of full membership of the Board of Directors.

## Article 6, Officers

Officers. The officers of the Chapter shall be a President, a President-Elect, one or more Vice-Presidents, but not to exceed eight, as provided in the By-Laws of the Chapter, and members of the Board of Directors. All officers must be members of the American Statistical Association and of the Chapter."

Terms of Office. Each officer shall serve for one year or until a successor is chosen.

Election and Installation. Each year election and installation of officers of the Chapter shall proceed as follows: not later than March 15, a Nominating Committee, appointed by the President, shall nominate one eligible person for each office; such nominations shall be announced at the April general meeting of the Chapter; not later than April 30, any group of fifteen or more members of the Chapter may nominate other persons for any or all offices by presenting to the Vice-President, Secretary a petition to that effect. An election of officers shall be held under whichever of the following conditions is applicable:

If there be only one nominee for each office, the nominees shall be considered elected and the officers installed at the May general meeting of the Chapter.

If there be more than one nominee for any office, or if there be only one nominee for each office and the President, with the consent of the Board, deems it desirable, the election shall proceed as follows: not later than May 15, the Vice-President, Secretary shall mail to each Chapter member one ballot for the election of officers from among the persons nominated and such other eligible persons as the members may enter on the ballots by writing in names. These ballots must be returned to the Vice-President, Secretary by May 31. By June 15, the Officers of the Chapter shall count the ballots received, determine the election, and effect the installation of officers as of July 1.

<u>Vacancies</u>. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancy which may occur, between elections, in any office.

<u>Duties</u>. Unless otherwise stated in the Constitution and By-Laws of this Chapter, or otherwise determined by the Board of Directors or the Chapter membership, the duties of the officers shall be as set forth in <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>, the most recent edition.

## Article 7, Meetings

There shall be one or more general meetings of the Chapter each year, held at such time and place as the President, with the aid of other officers, may direct. There shall be as many other meetings, of members generally or of special groups of members, as the activities of the Chapter may require.

### Article 8, Committees

The Committees of the Chapter and Chapter representatives other than the Representatives to the District Committee shall be appointed by the President with the counsel of the other Officers, the Directors, and such other Chapter members as the President may choose. Also, any 15 members of the Chapter may petition the President to appoint such committee or committees as they believe desirable. All Chapter members are eligible for appointment to committees.

#### Article 9, Resolutions

Resolutions shall be voted (a) by the Board of Directors or (b) by the members at any general meeting at which thirty per cent of the Chapter membership is present. Resolutions shall require a two-thirds majority vote of the entire Board or of the members present at a general meeting which is attended by at least 30 per cent of the Chapter membership. Resolutions of this Chapter shall be so phrased as not to imply that they are policy of the American Statistical Association.

#### Article 10, Amendments

Amendments to this Constitution may be proposed by the Board of Directors or by a petition signed by 10 members. An amendment originating by petition shall be referred to the Board of Directors for its recommendation as to method of ratification.

Following action by the Board of Directors, the Secretary shall publish a copy of the proposed amendment and the Board's recommendation and shall mail it to all Chapter members. Unless the Board decides that the proposed amendment is of such urgency as to require a special mail ballot, the amendment shall be submitted to the members for mail vote at the time of the annual election of officers. Ratification shall require an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the mail ballots returned, provided that ballots have been returned by not less than thirty per cent of the membership within one month from the date of its mailing.

## Article 11, Ratification

When two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors of the Chapter have approved this Constitution, the Secretary shall mail copies of it, along with a ballot, to all members of the Chapter. Ratification shall require an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the mail ballots returned, provided that ballots have been received from not less than thirty per cent of the members within one month from the date of mailing. When ratified, this Constitution shall supersede any previous Constitution of the Chapter, as of the September 1 following.

# CHICAGO CHAPTER, AMERICAN STATISTICAL ASSOCIATION (As amended in April, 1980)

#### Article 1, Membership

- 1. Membership Year. The membership year shall be August first to July thirty-first.
- 2. Termination of Membership. (a) A member may resign from the Chapter by notifying the Vice-President for Membership. There shall be no reimbursement of dues under these circumstances. (b) The privileges of membership in the Chapter shall terminate on November 1 each year, if by that date payment of dues for the ensuing year has not been received.
- 3. Membership Dues Exemption. (a) The Board of Directors may, at its discretion, adjust the annual dues of a member of the Chapter or a class of members for such period as it designates. (b) Honorary Members, elected by the Board of Directors, shall not be required to pay dues, but may vote as regular members.

#### Article 2, Finance

- 1. Dues. The Board shall determine the amount of dues.
- 2. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year shall be August first to July thirty-first.
- 3. Financial Authority. All funds of the Chapter shall be deposited with the Treasurer who shall make disbursements therefrom under supervision and regulation of the Board.
- 4. Financial Relationship with the American Statistical Association. (a) The American Statistical Association shall not be responsible for the debts of this Chapter nor shall this Chapter hold itself liable for the obligations of the American Statistical Association. (b) The Treasurer of the Chapter shall submit an annual report to the American Statistical Association and collect such credits as are due the Chapter pursuant to Article 11, Section 6, of the By-Laws of the American Statistical Association.

### Article 3, Vice-Presidents

There shall be eight Vice-Presidents of the Chapter. They shall be denominated as follows according to their principal responsibility: a Vice-President for Special Events, a Vice-President for Conferences, a Vice-President for Luncheon Programs, a Vice-President for Membership, a Vice-President for Communications, and a Vice-President for Workshops; in addition, the Secretary and Treasurer shall be Vice-Presidents. In the absence of the President, the President-Elect shall assume the duties of the President.

## Article 4, Ratification and Amendment

The process for ratification of these By-Laws shall be the same as for ratification of the Constitution of the Chapter. These By-Laws may be amended by the Board of Directors as prescribed by Article V of the Constitution.
