### A Message from our Leadership Team

I am honoured to be appointed to the position of MSR Associate Chair from August 2025. The role of the MSR Associate Chair is to support the MSR Chair (Tom Culham) for the 12-month period. I had an opportunity to work with Tom earlier in the Life-Boat for MSR Research Methods and I found it a very enjoyable experience; I am fortunate to be able to continue the association. I take over this role from Raysa Rocha, who did such a brilliant job earlier as MSR Associate Chair and has set the bar quite high.

I am a computer engineer by background, with an MBA and PhD in management, and I had the privilege to be educated in the leading institutions in India. My PhD thesis was on the role of culture in international business, and this exposed me to the strengths and limitations of the application of scientific paradigms to the social sciences. I started my research career with a heavily quantitative approach to studying culture [sic] and then dabbled in emancipatory critical and philosophical perspectives. My current research perspective is anchored in decolonial and pluralist perspectives, as it is the need of the hour for management research to tap into truly context sensitive and indigenous perspectives.

In using the term “indigenous”, I do not mean the study of marginalised communities, but the entire rest of the world except small parts of US and Europe where management theories may have originated. Indigenous to me means that which is genuinely true to the context and carries meaningful implications for the people in that context. I believe that in order to tap into indigenous wisdom, it is necessary to approach it with not just alternate methodologies but alternate philosophical paradigms. The study of spirituality by its very nature challenges all the paradigms that we have known so far and pushes the frontiers of research methodologies. The leadership in MSR nurtures radical open mindedness and pluralist perspectives, where inclusivity goes beyond mere tolerance of difference to genuine hospitality towards a multiplicity of perspectives. I believe therefore that MSR is a precious space that carries the immense potential for rejuvenating management research at large. In my role as MSR Associate Chair, my purpose is to contribute towards holding this space.

## Current Trends in MSR Research



### Exploring innovative approaches in management education and interdisciplinary research

I am happy to share two of my most recent research projects that explore innovative approaches in management education and interdisciplinary conversations.

First, with my colleagues Isabel Rimanoczy and Divya Singhal I have edited "[The Power of Arts-Based Pedagogies: Transforming Mindsets to Shape Our Future](#)," set for release by Routledge in its PRME series in March 2026. This practical toolkit presents innovative pedagogical approaches that integrate art into education for sustainability across various institutional settings. This research trend indicates a growing emphasis on experiential and transformative learning in management education. It reflects a shift towards more holistic approaches in MSR, recognizing the power of art to evoke not only cognitive, but emotional and behavioural responses that can lead to deeper understanding and personal growth. For MSR, this trend opens up new possibilities for developing mindful, empathetic leaders who can navigate complex ethical and spiritual dimensions in the workplace, potentially leading to more sustainable and humanistic management practices.

Looking ahead to 2027, with Nicholas Burton we are co-editing a special review issue of the Journal of Management, Spirituality and Religion on "[Broadening Management, Spirituality and Religion Research: Crosscutting Dialogue Across Disciplines](#)." This issue aims to advance our understanding of MSR through broad engagement across fields. We welcome submissions that offer novel theoretical, methodological, or integrative contributions, particularly those that challenge established assumptions and forge connections between management studies, spirituality, religion, and broader social sciences and humanities. This research trend indicates a growing recognition of the need for interdisciplinary approaches in MSR studies. This trend opens up new avenues for exploring the intersections of spirituality, religion, and management practices, potentially leading to more holistic and culturally nuanced understanding of leadership, ethics, and organizational behavior in diverse global contexts.
