2025 IM Division Hyundai Motor Eminent Scholar Award



We are pleased to announce that **Dr. Julian Birkinshaw** of Ivey Business School has been selected as the **2025 IM Division Hyundai Motor Eminent Scholar!** Join us during the AOM Meeting for a special session where Dr. Birkinshaw's work will be recognized, scheduled for Sunday, July 27.

Dr. Julian Birkinshaw is Dean of Ivey Business School in Canada. He studied at the University of Durham in the UK (BSc) and Ivey Business School in Canada (MBA, PhD), and worked at the Stockholm School of Economics (1995-1999) and London Business School (1999-2024). He was awarded Honorary Doctorates by the Stockholm School of Economics in 2009 and Copenhagen Business School in 2018. He is a Fellow of the British Academy, the Strategic Management Society, the Academy of International Business, and the (American) Academy of Management.

Professor Birkinshaw is a recognised thought-leader on the impact of digital technology on the strategy and organization of established companies. He is also known for his research on organizational ambidexterity, management innovation, and multinational subsidiary evolution. He won the best paper award at the Academy of Management Review in 2008 for "Management Innovation" and at the Harvard Business Review in 2022 for "How Incumbents Survive and Thrive." He is the author of sixteen books, including Fast/Forward (2017), Becoming a Better Boss (2013), and the forthcoming Resurgent: How established companies can fight back and thrive in an age of digital transformation (2025).

Professor Birkinshaw is frequently ranked as one of the "Thinkers 50" top thought leaders in the field of Management, and is quoted in international media outlets such as CNN, BBC, The Economist, the Wall Street Journal, and The Times. He is a regular keynote speaker and a consultant to large companies around the world.

Please meet Dr. Björkman and other Professional Award winners on Tuesday at the AOM Plenary session.

Ingmar Björkman is Rector (President) of Hanken School of Economics in Helsinki, Finland. Before joining Hanken, Björkman served as Dean and faculty member at Aalto University School of Business. He has been a visiting professor at INSEAD, ESSEC and Hong Kong University, and an adjunct professor at BI Norwegian School of Management.

Ingmar's research interests focus on people management issues in international organizations. Ingmar is a winner of the JIBS Decade Award (with D. Minbaeva, T. Pedersen, C. Fey & H-J. Park). His latest book is Global Challenge: Managing People across Borders (fourth edition, 2023), co-authored with Vladimir Pucik, Paul Evans, and Günter Stahl. He is a co-author of two Case House award-winning teaching cases (with Charles Galunic, and Adam Smale and Johanna Saarinen).

Ingmar has served on various committees of EQUIS and AACSB. He is a member of the international advisory boards of Prague University of Economics and Business; Barcelona School of Management, Pompeu Fabra University; and Louvain School of Management. He is also a member of the board of Chalmers University of Technology.

Ingmar received the *International Educator of the Year Award* from the Academy of International Business in 2019 and the *EIASM Interdisciplinary Leader Award* in 2021.

2025 IM Division Outstanding Service to the Global Community Award

We are pleased to announce that **Alvaro Cuervo-Cazurra** of Northeastern University's D'Amore-McKim School of Business has been selected as the recipient of the **2025 IM Division Outstanding Service to the Global Community Award!**



Alvaro Cuervo-Cazurra is the CEM Professor of Global Sustainability and Professor of International Business and Strategy at Northeastern University's D'Amore-McKim School of Business. He is also a Fellow of the Academy of International Business. A leading scholar in global strategy, his research explores how context, particularly in emerging markets, influences value creation. His primary research focus is global strategic management, with a particular emphasis on how institutions impact internationalization and firm performance. Additionally, he investigates global sustainable governance, examining the roles of ownership

and incentives in driving sustainability and creating societal value.

Professor Cuervo-Cazurra has been actively engaged in leadership roles in the academic community, including serving on the Executive Committee of the International Management Division of the Academy of Management and as a representative-at-large in the Global Strategy Interest Group ofthe Strategic Management Society. He has also contributed to the development of the profession as co-editor of the *Global Strategy Journal*, consulting editor of the *Journal of International Business Studies*, and an editorial board member for the *Academy of Management Journal*, *Academy of Management Review*, and *Strategic Management Journal*.

He holds a Ph.D. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and an honorary doctorate from Copenhagen Business School. Dr. Cuervo-Cazurra teaches courses on strategy, global strategy, and sustainability and consults with multinationals and government agencies on internationalization strategies.

Juan Bu is an Assistant Professor of International Business and Rodney Merritt Miller Faculty Fellow at the Kelley School of Business, Indiana University. She received her Ph.D. from the University of Miami in 2018. Her research interests include cross-border acquisitions, innovation, and sustainability, particularly in the context of emerging markets. Her current projects explore climate innovation, sustainability disclosure, and decarbonization in global value chains, aiming to understand how multinational

enterprises can contribute to building a more sustainable world.

Juan's research has been published in leading academic journals, including the Strategic Management Journal, Journal of International Business Studies, Journal of Management, Journal of World Business, Strategic Entrepreneurship Journal, and others. She is on the editorial review board of the Journal of International Business Studies, Global Strategy Journal, and Management and Organization Review. She is the associate editor of Business Horizons.

Juan has won many research awards including the Indiana University Outstanding Junior Faculty Award, the Women in the Academy of International Business (AIB) Emerging Scholar Award, the Kelley School of Business Research Award, several Best Paper Awards on Emerging Markets and Sustainability from both the Academy of Management and the AIB, and others. She served as the Vice President of the AIB US Northeast Chapter and served as the Program Chair of the AIB US Northeast 2023 Annual Conference. Prior to her academic career, she worked for China Mobile in Guangzhou, China, and Unilever's global headquarters in London, UK.
