<p>Infection counts (facility wide, and unit specific), are displayed in a visually simple format so staff can easily and quickly assess the HAI infection counts.</p> <p>CLABSI CAUTI CDI MRSA bacteremia VRE bacteremia</p> <p>HH rates per discipline and department are also posted at bottom of board.</p>	<p>Boards are placed in all clinical units – in break rooms.</p>	<p>Infection rates are updated quarterly – not cumulative. Could do cumulative but it seems to not be as impactful as staff never get to see “empty pockets”.</p>	<p>-staff have limited time and benefit from getting data at a glance, rather than studying charts, tables, etc. - the patient figures (male and female), reminds staff that behind each infection is a person.</p>	<p>Supplies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3M sticky cork board (18x22”)</li> <li>• Wall friendly command strips for mounting</li> <li>• Graphics – suns (happy faces), denim pockets labeled with each infection category, shadow figures, numbers All laminated and cut and assembled</li> <li>• Background colored paper</li> <li>• Velcro tabs so that numbers can be easily changed out. Could also use dry-erase on laminated pockets.</li> </ul> <p>Student volunteers cut all pieces and assembled board.</p>
