A path to success for new and long term IPs performing surveillance:

- New to SSI surveillance- Don't feel like a failure- to FAIL is only the:
- ¬ First
- ¬ Attempt
- \neg In
- Learning
- Experienced in SSI surveillance- Frustrated by nuances and differences in interpretation- NHSN working to resolve/align, ask a question

Tips

Make a timeline of elements

- Shut out the "noise" (not a part of SSI criteria)
- Ask NHSN

- Keep your documentation for rationale of determination made
- Use resources- PSM Ch 9 Appendix A (eligible event types by procedure), Table 4 (hierarchy of procedures); SSI FAQs

Frequently Asked Questions

• Date of event- must fall within surveillance period (count the days) but other elements to meet final designation may come shortly after

- SI SSI determination by physician designation:
 - ¬ Can use coded diagnosis
 - Can use physician documentation of "wound" or "skin infection"
- Pus/Purulent drainage:
 - Color plus consistency
 - ¬ Only two colors "count"- yellow or green

Imaging Criteria

• Imaging:

- ¬ Equivocal imaging- fluid collection, abscess or seroma/hematoma, etc. Clinical correlation- Can use antimicrobial indication on MAR BUT must be specific to site criteria, eg, yes for intraabdominal infection, but not empirically for infection
- Definitive imaging- abscess or infection present

Patient Complaints Criteria

Patient complaints:

- ¬ C/o "pus" or "purulence", or other acceptable description= meets SI SSI criteria if documented in record as occurring in surveillance timeframe
- ¬ C/o nausea "due to overeating"= does not exclude use of nausea symptom due to other cause; determination if due to another cause should be made by provider

Invasive Manipulation (IM) Criteria

NHSN established to avoid penalizing facilities for manipulation later resulting in infection

 Has not met intent as most IM is done because infection is suspected (one of three criteria under which use of IM cannot be used to exclude SSI)
