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	 and February had the highest death totals. Case rate for week 12/30 75.5 per 100,000 Flu – saw an increase, but starting to see a dip recently. More Flu A than Flu B. For the week ending in 12/30, 195 Flu A and 13 Flu B. Monitoring of flu between October through the end of March Free Flu, COVID-19, and RSV testing – Partner with Children's Mercy – will come to the Missouri public health building and perform testing for anyone who is wanting testing, no appointment needed. Testing results 12-48 hours through Children's Mercy Looking at the Watershed numbers as well for flu/COVID Overdose Reporting Ordinance – New reportable condition, Started on January 1st, 2024 – Schedule 1-5 report within 5 days, outside of Schedule 1-5 report within 30 days. a. Will depend on reporting structure who will report out the overdoses – In some cases, Infection Prevention would be reporting this. Wanted to bring awareness to the group in case b.
