The Montana Infection Control Mentorship Program is a 12-week peer to peer mentoring program designed to support new infection control practitioners in Montana. New ICPs are matched with an experienced ICP and meet weekly over the course of 3 months to build skills, advance knowledge, and learn tips and tricks from seasoned peers.
