Change in HHS Rulemaking Policy



Key Update:

HHS Secretary Robert F. Kennedy, Jr. rescinds public input policy for proposed regulations.



Background:

"Notice and comment" process mandated by the Administrative Procedure Act of 1946 (APA).

Designed to encourage public and expert input in regulation development.



Rationale:

Secretary Kennedy determined all HHS regulations qualify for the APA's "good cause" exception.

This exception allows bypassing the standard process when it is deemed:

- Impracticable
- Unnecessary
- Contrary to public interest

Alert:

 CDC Health Alert Network (HAN) issues guidance on measles outbreak in Texas and New Mexico.

Outbreak Details:

- o Confirmed cases in Texas and New Mexico: 208.
- Reported deaths: One in each state.
- Additional cases reported in 10 other jurisdictions across the U.S.

• Prevention Recommendation:

 CDC advises all U.S. residents to ensure they are up to date on MMR vaccinations.

Key Information:

 CDC Health Alert Network (HAN) provides an update on dengue virus infection risks and testing recommendations.

Areas of Concern:


- o High transmission zones:
 - Parts of the U.S.
 - Puerto Rico
 - U.S. Virgin Islands
 - Other regions in the Americas.

Seasonal Considerations:

 Peak dengue season coincides with spring and summer travel.

Presidential Nomination of Dr. Susan Monarez as CDC Director



Key Announcement:

The President nominated **Susan Monarez, Ph.D.**, as CDC director following the withdrawal of a previous nomination.



Background:

Dr. Monarez previously served as the **deputy director** of the Advanced Research Projects Agency for Health (ARPA-H).

She was the opening speaker at APIC's 2024 AI Summit.



Notable Contribution:

Discussed the **impact of information technology** on infection prevention and control (IPC).

HHS Reorganization and Workforce Reduction

• Key Announcement:

- HHS to restructure in response to the President's workforce reduction order.
- o Effective date: Late May 2025.
- Workforce reduction: 20,000 full-time employees.

• Impactful Changes:

- o NIOSH: Moved from CDC to the new Administration for a Healthy America.
- ASPR: Transferred to CDC.
- o AHRQ and ASPE: Combined into a new Office of Strategy.
- o CMS and ACF: Merged into the Administration for Community Living (ACL).

• Employee Cuts:

o FDA: 3,500

o CDC: 2,400

o NIH: 1,200

o CMS: 300

Support AHRQ FY26 Funding:

Proposed funding: \$500 million.

Coalition letter to Chair and Ranking Members of the House and Senate Appropriations Labor, HHS, Education, and Related Agencies Subcommittees.

Increase Wastewater Surveillance Funding:

Proposed increase: **\$20 million** for CDC's National Wastewater Surveillance System.
