



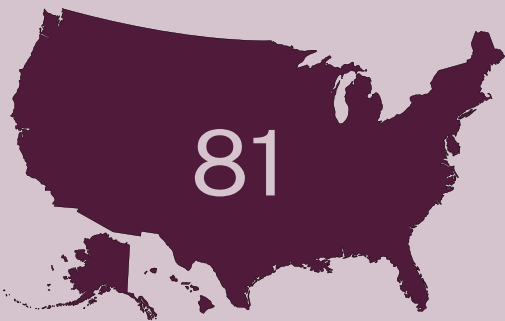

PLA has collected and analyzed data to understand how the federal government shutdown is impacting the nonprofit partners of America's public lands.

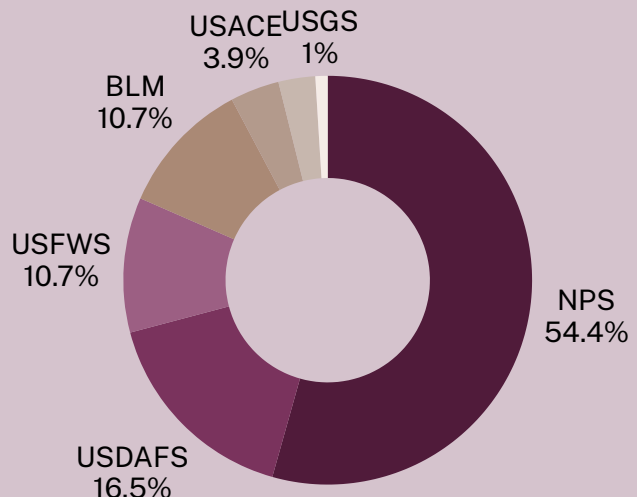
## Who is Represented

Nonprofit partners are organizations with formal philanthropic or operational agreements with federal land management agencies. They provide critical services and support.



Data was collected from 81 nonprofit partner organizations across the United States.

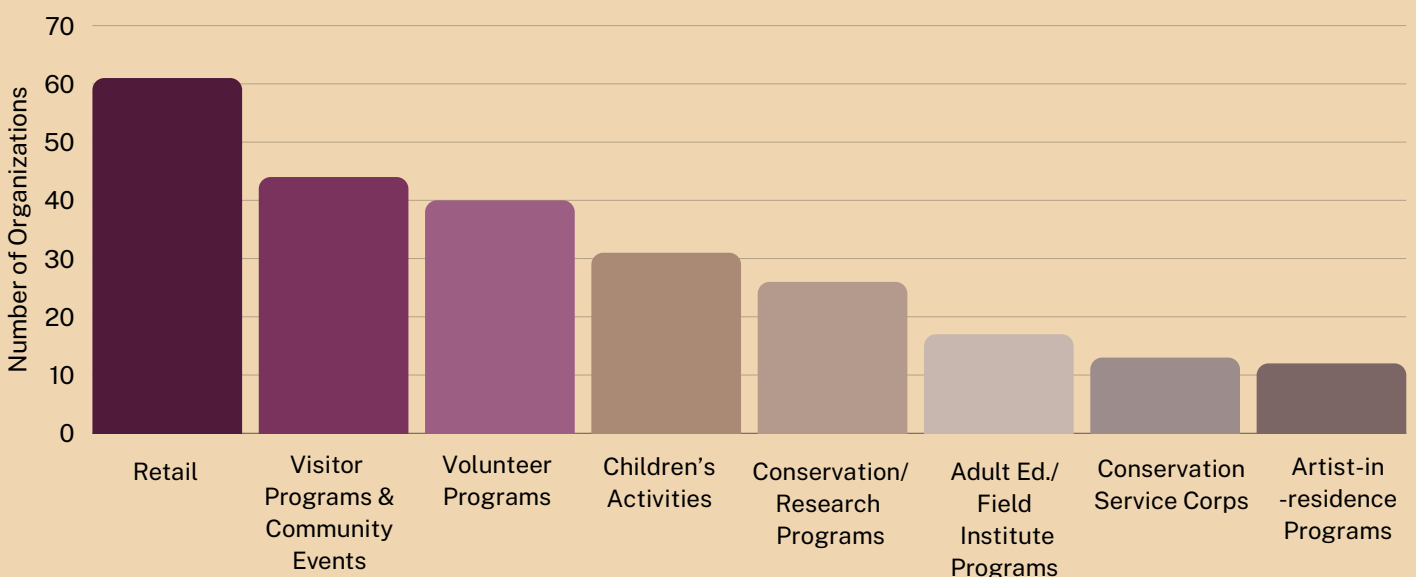

## How Partners are Impacted

Partners often share critical facilities and infrastructure with their agency partners. If facilities are not open, partners cannot operate. As independent organizations, there is no opportunity to recoup funds lost during a shutdown.

### Many partners have been forced to stop critical operations and activities



**\$5.3 Million**

in lost retail and program revenue



These funds would have been reinvested into critical programs and operations on our public lands.

Due to the uncertainty of when they will be fully operational again, partners are having to lay off or furlough staff.

**As of 10.28, this has impacted 490 staff.**
