APS Global Physics Summit 2026

The 2026 Joint March Meeting and April Meeting — referred to as the APS Global Physics Summit — is the largest physics research conference in the world. It will gather over 14,000 leading scientists, physicists, and students worldwide, offering exhibitors and sponsors unparalleled engagement with the global scientific community.

The in-person APS Global Physics Summit 2026 will take place on March 15-20, 2026, at the Colorado Convention Center, Denver, CO. Meeting sessions include particles and fields, astrophysics, gravitational physics, nuclear physics, beams, hadronic physics, and physics education research. The APS DAP is starting to assemble the program of astrophysics sessions and is sponsoring 15 invited sessions this year and 3 mini-symposia (including joint sessions with other divisions both from the March and April meetings).

Caregiver and Travel Awards

Cecilia Payne-Gaposchkin Doctoral Dissertation Award

DAP is soliciting nominations for the DAP Cecilia Payne-Gaposchkin Doctoral Dissertation Award in Astrophysics. This award recognizes doctoral thesis research in astrophysics and encourages effective written and oral presentation of research results. The annual award consists of \$1,500 for the recipient, a certificate, meeting registration waiver, and all finalists will receive a travel reimbursement of up to \$750 in order to present their work in an invited session at the APS March-April Meeting.

Guided by our core values, APS encourages nominations that **reflect the full range of talent**, **distinction**, **and experience in our field**, **and supports broad canvassing for professionals across diverse backgrounds**, **perspectives**, **and expertise**.

DAP Prizes

DAP APS Fellow

- Next application round: ~ June 2026
- Recognizes members who may have made advances in physics through original research and publication, or made significant innovative contributions in the application of physics to science and technology. They may also have made significant contributions to the teaching of physics and the mentoring of early-career scientists, as well as to service and participation in the Society's activities, promoting the advancement of historically marginalized scientists, public promotion of STEM careers, and leadership within the physics community. The selection is conducted by one's professional peers, and newly elected Fellows number no more than 0.5% of Society membership.

• Hans A. Bethe Prize

- Next application round: ~ June 2026
- Recognizes outstanding work in theory, experiment or observation in the areas of astrophysics, nuclear physics, nuclear astrophysics, or closely related fields.

Edward A. Bouchet Award

- Next application round: ~ April 2026
- Recognizes a distinguished minoritized physicist who has made significant contributions to physics research and the advancement of underrepresented minority scientists.
- Maria Goeppert Mayer Award
 - Next application round: ~ June 2026
 - Recognizes outstanding achievement by a woman physicist in the early years of her career, and provides opportunities for her to present these

achievements to others through public lectures in the spirit of Maria Goeppert Mayer.

General APS Prizes

- George E. Valley Jr.
 - Next application round: ~ May 2026
 - Recognizes an early-career individual for an outstanding scientific contribution to physics that is deemed to have significant potential for a dramatic impact on the field.
- <u>Julius Edgar Lilienfeld</u>
 - Next application round: ~ May 2026
 - Recognizes outstanding contributions to physics and exceptional skills in lecturing to diverse audiences.
- APS Medal
 - Next application round: ~ May 2026
 - The APS Medal was established to recognize contributions of the highest level that advance our knowledge and understanding of the physical universe in all its facets. It is intended to celebrate scientific inquiry and the pursuit of knowledge.

Note, only APS members are eligible for <u>Fellowship</u>. In order to ensure a strong and diverse Division of Astrophysics, we ask you to encourage your colleagues to join APS within the DAP unit (at marginal extra cost) if they have not already done so.

DAP Executive Committee Election

Prior to the APS Global Physics Summit 2026, five new officers will be elected to the DAP Executive Committee.

The open positions will be:

- 1. Vice Chair (4-year term)
- 2. Councilor (4-year term, starting January 1, 2026)
- 3. 2 Members-at-Large (2-year term)
- 4. 1 Early Career Member-at-Large (2-year term)

September is a key month in the US federal budgetary process, and we encourage our members to join the DAP EC and chairline as we reach out to our Congress members in support of robust scientific funding for NASA, NSF, and the DOE.
