2017 Orlando Tandem Meeting Update:

A few notes on the ASBMT Tandem Meeting held February 22-26, 2017 in Orlando Florida.

As a long-time attendee of the BMT Tandem Meetings, I found that the nursing sessions (coordinated jointly between ASBMT Nursing Special Interest Group and Oncology Nursing Society) were exceptionally well done this year. Over three days, there was a diverse range of topics including: Transfusion Free Transplant, Best Nursing Abstracts, Ethics, BMT Emergencies and Reproductive Issues. One of my personal favorites was BMT Emergencies presented by Juan Pinelli, PA-C, MMSc, from the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center. His presentation covered a wide range of toxicities seen in transplant from hemorrhagic cystitis, typhlitis, infections, neurologic, cardiovascular and more. He outlined, presentation, diagnostic work up, prevention and treatment strategies across each emergency presented. Mr. Pinelli was well organized, informative and professional.

One wonderful aspect of the BMT Tandem Meetings is as a conference participant you have so many choices about what sessions to attend. There are sessions devoted to the science, pharmacy, pediatrics, nursing, advanced practice and administrative topics. The challenge with so many choices is of course deciding which lectures to attend. A good problem to have!

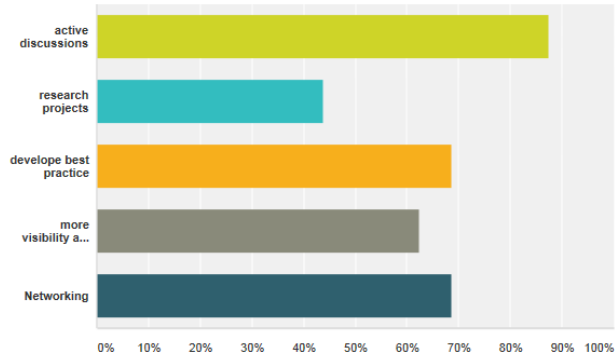
What is upcoming:

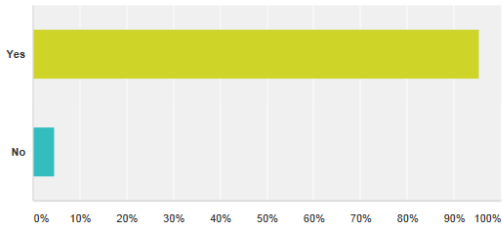
As a member of the SIG, what are your expectations. Please choose any that apply

Answered: 16 Skipped: 6



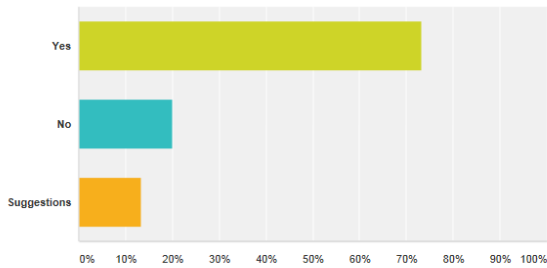
Are you a current SIG member

Answered: 22 Skipped: 0



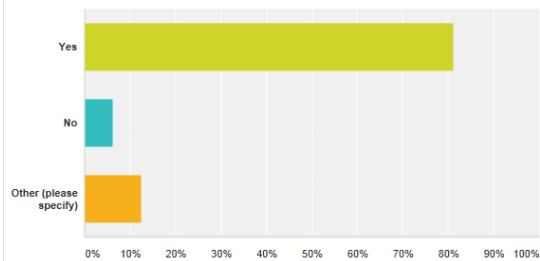
Would you be interested in being on a committee, helping with website, planning meetings

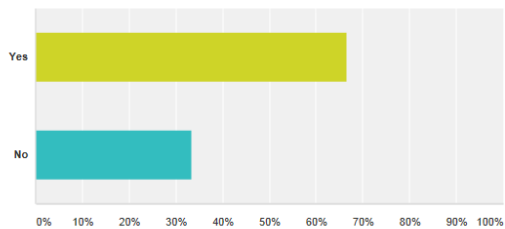
Do you feel there is a need for a BMTCN review course at Tandem

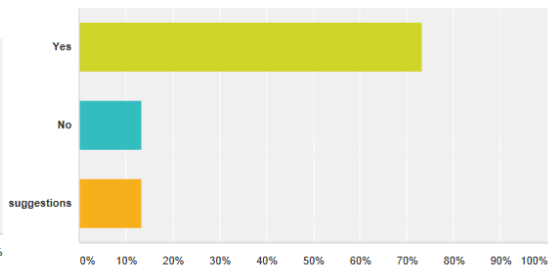
Would you be interested in joining a committee to plan a review course

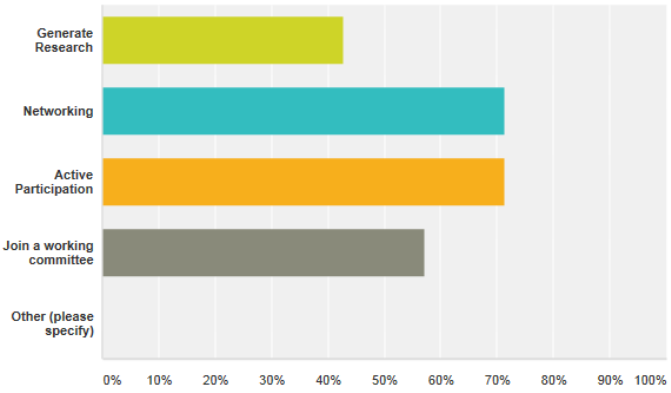
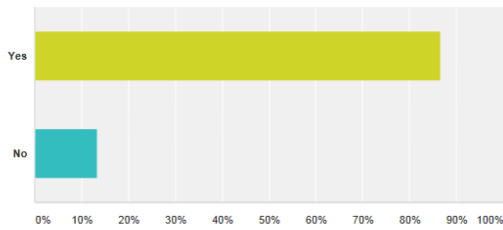


What more would you like as a member of the nursing SIG. Please choose any that apply.
