### **ASCLS-NY Helps Fight Pancreatic Cancer**

Since spring 2024, ASCLS-NY has supported the Lustgarten Foundation for pancreatic cancer research (the “Foundation”). As a constituent society, we have joined together to fight a disease that the American Cancer Society estimates more than 67,000 cases in 2025 in the U.S. alone. #### **Who Is The Lustgarten Foundation?**

The Lustgarten Foundation was formed in 1998 shortly after founder, Marc Lustgarten, Cablevision Vice Chairman, was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. Lack of research at the time served as the driving force behind Mr. Lustgarten’s desire to establish the Foundation before his death in 1999. Today, the Lustgarten Foundation has invested \$301 million in 366 research projects significantly impacting the 5-year relative survival rate increase to 13%. The Foundation has awarded 10 new grants in 2025 to researchers at 8 leading institutions in continuation of its dedication to addressing the critical need for progress in pancreatic cancer research. The Foundation’s commitment to advancing lifesaving science toward its mission of transforming pancreatic cancer into a curable disease aligns with ASCLS-NY’s commitment to patient centered healthcare and community wellness.

#### **How Much Money Has ASCLS-NY Raised For The Foundation?**

Our members have participated in charity walks throughout the State of New York, recruiting friends, students, coworkers, and family, raising \$1,295 to date. Great job!

Each year, ASCLS-NY offers three outstanding scholarship opportunities—two for ASCLS-NY Developing Professional undergraduate students (one MLS and one MLT) and one for a member who has been accepted into a graduate program to advance their education and career.

For undergraduate scholarships, the key is to become an ASCLS Developing Professional Member, for students entering their final year by **December 31, 2025**. Eligible undergraduate members will receive scholarship information and the application form via email by the end of February. Applications are due **April 19, 2026**.

Graduate scholarship details will be emailed by the end of March, with applications due **May 17, 2026**. Scholarship information is also available at any time on our website.

An impartial panel of ASCLS-NY members will review the applications and select the recipients. Awardees will be announced at the Spring Seminar in June.


Dermatomycosis, a contagious fungal infection, typically infects


#### ANSWER:

Dermatomycosis is more frequently called tinea or ringworm and is a contagious fungal infection affecting hair, skin and nails. The patches produced on the skin have raised edges that were thought to contain a small circular worm, thus the name ringworm. The causative agents are referred to as the dermatophytes and consist of the genera *Microsporum*, *Epidermophyton* and *Trichophyton*. These fungi can be differentiated by the appearance of the macroconidia that each genus produces. Microscopic identification is enhanced with dyes such as lactophenol cotton blue.



*Microsporum*—"spindle shaped" macroconidia



*Trichophyton*—"pencil shaped" macroconidia



*Epidermophyton*—"beaver tail" macroconidia
