ASFMRA Member Focus

David Lawhon - Lumberton, NC

I am David S. Lawhon, a Certified General Appraiser licensed in North Carolina, Virginia and South Carolina. I am the owner of David Lawhon Appraisal, Inc. along with my wife, Ann Lawhon. I currently reside in Apex, NC just outside of Raleigh, NC near my daughter Meredith and her husband Jason, and their little boy Hudson (age 5).

I have been in the appraisal profession for 45 years starting in Farm Credit in 1975. After 10+ years with Farm Credit, I began appraising full time in 1986. Starting as a residential appraiser and progressing to



commercial and finally landing in Agricultural properties full time. Currently I am a Board member of the Carolinas-Virginias Chapter. I have served as the President and Board member of the North Carolina Society of Farm Managers and Rural Appraisers. Describe your experience and education related to the farm property professional appraisal field.

I began my appraisal career working for Farm Credit after four years at NC State University graduating with a B.S. degree in Agricultural Engineering. I started in Sanford, N.C. and later moved to Carthage, N.C. which was my hometown. Working close to home was good and when time permitted, I helped on the family farm. My experience gained from Farm Credit was in - valuable for appraising and for knowledge of the loan process for agricultural properties. You have to take the time to build relationships, get to know your clients, and take the time to do a good appraisal report.
