

Reconstructive Urologist – Portland Oregon

The Department of Urology at Oregon Health and Science University is recruiting a second fellowship-trained reconstructive urologist to join our faculty. We are seeking physician candidates who share our drive to be a leading treatment and research department, to exceed the expectations of our patients with the quality of care we provide, and provide the best possible learning environment for medical students, urology residents and fellows.

Candidates will be trained and experienced in urethral and genital reconstructive surgery, to include open surgical, minimally invasive, and robotic techniques. The candidate should be interested in gender-affirming surgery and will have dedicated time to train with Dr. Daniel Dugi to learn these techniques. Responsibilities will include one day per week at the Portland VA Medical Center and four days per week at the OHSU Hospital in both outpatient and surgical settings.

Candidates will possess a strong interest in scholarly research activity in outcomes research or basic/translational science. Candidates should demonstrate a proven track record of collaborative research and authorship of publications in peer reviewed journals and plan to pursue extramural funding.

The selected applicant will participate in teaching through weekly grand rounds and educational conferences as well as modeling and mentoring medical students, interns, residents and postdoctoral fellows with evidence-based medicine.

Faculty members are strongly encouraged to participate in university and public service through university and hospital committee work and participation in their respective professional organizations.
