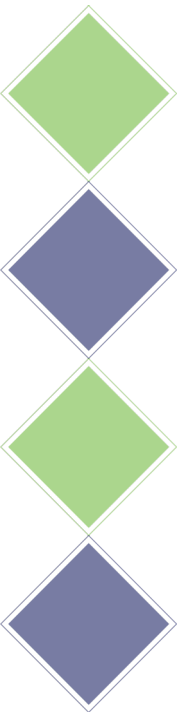
What is HAMPCAS?

- Health Administration, Management, and Policy Centralized Application Service (HAMPCAS)
- Designed for students applying to graduate programs in health administration, healthcare management, and health policy
- National, centralized application service enables you to apply to multiple colleges and universities through a single web-based application



Benefits of using HAMPCAS

- Reduces time and cost when applying to multiple programs
- Eliminates the duplication of efforts - system only requires one set of credentials
- Facilitates student exposure to a variety of schools
- Provides a user-friendly web application that allows you to:
 - Pay via e-commerce;
 - Update with new information after the initial submission;
 - Conduct "on-line" status check and have real-time access to application status and progress;
 - Download and print worksheets, allowing you to organize your material; and
 - Save progress and continue later

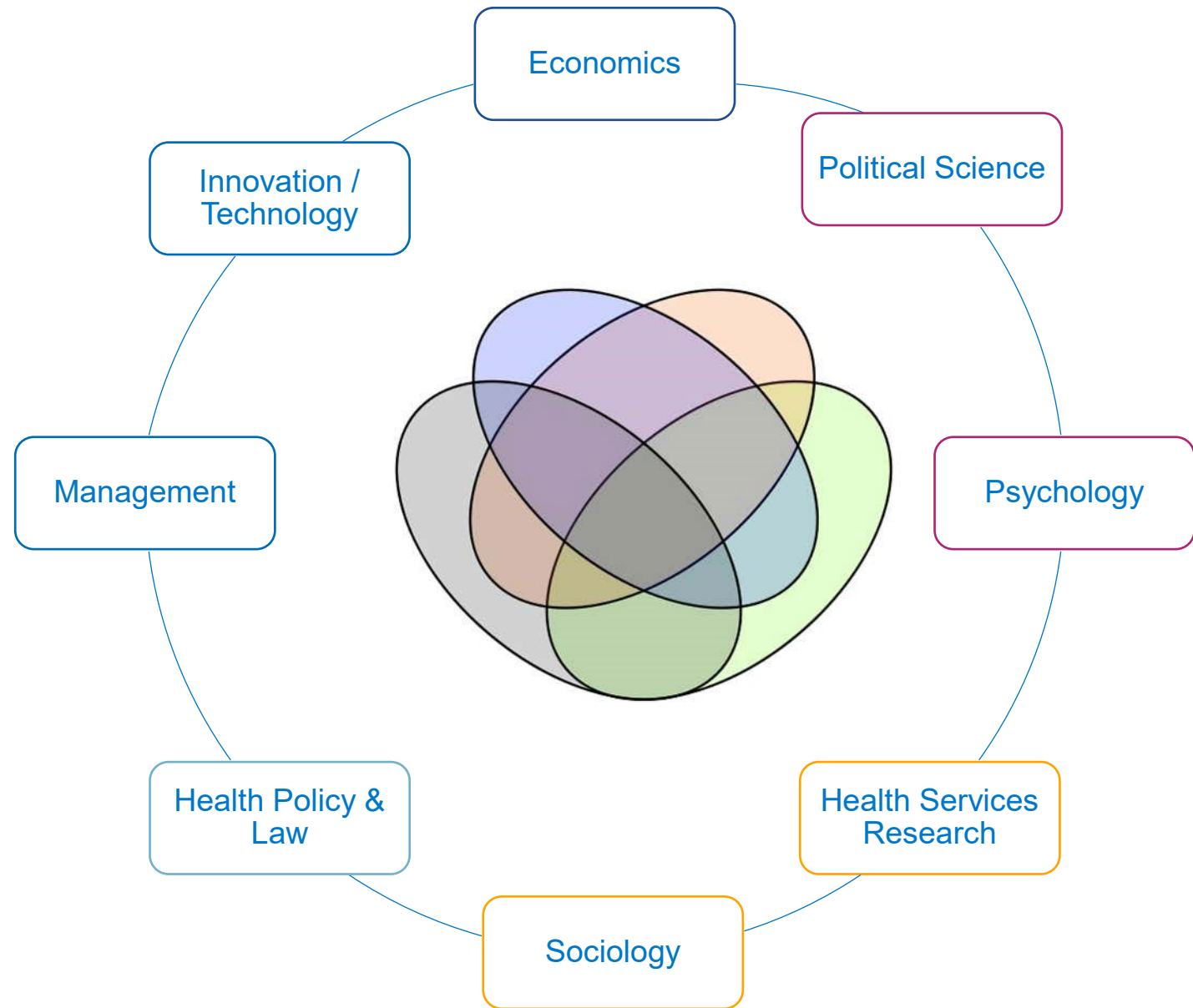

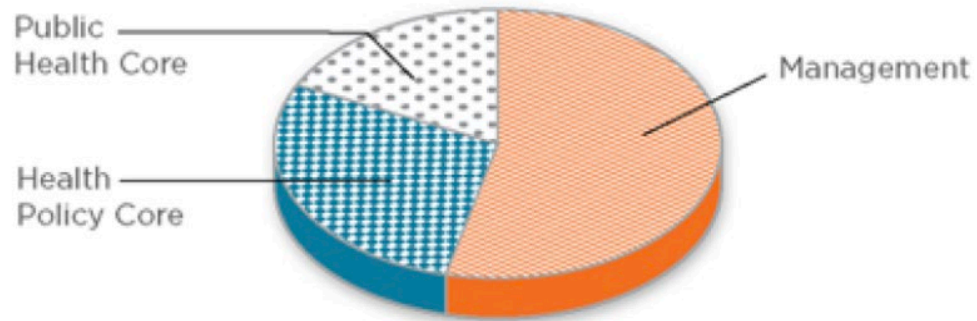

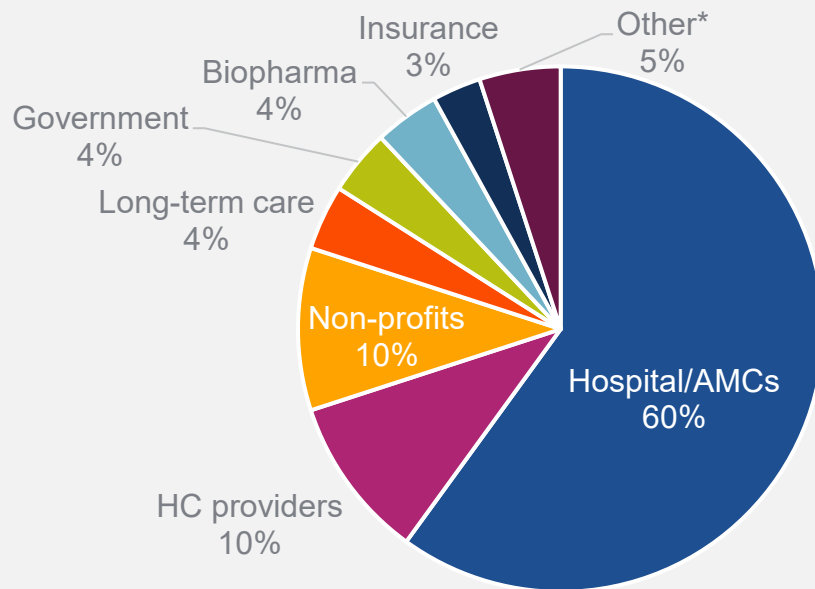

- Applicants must hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution.
- Our program considers factors beyond academics for admission, such as interest, experience, aptitude, and potential for success.
 - Complete a HAMPCAS application
 - Official transcripts from the institution you received your bachelor's degree
 - Resume
 - Personal Statement of professional goals
 - Official transcripts (suggested undergraduate GPA of 3.00)
 - One letter of recommendation from a professor, supervisor, or professional colleague.

Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores or other admissions test scores are NOT required

English Language Proficiency (ELP)

- Official ELP test scores required for **most** international applicants. Some countries are exempt.
- Accepted scores and minimum requirements for Texas A&M SPH
 - TOEFL iBT (95 or higher)
 - IELTS (7.0 on overall band score)
 - GRE Verbal (153 or higher)
- Individuals who completed & earned a bachelor's degree (completed all years), master's, or doctoral degree from a United States accredited institution, may qualify for alternative verification
 - Eligibility will be confirmed via official transcript for conferred U.S. degree
 - Date & degree awarded must be listed on official transcript at time of application

Foreign Degree Coursework

- For coursework completed outside of the US/English speaking Canada, a **WES ICAP** credential evaluation must be submitted

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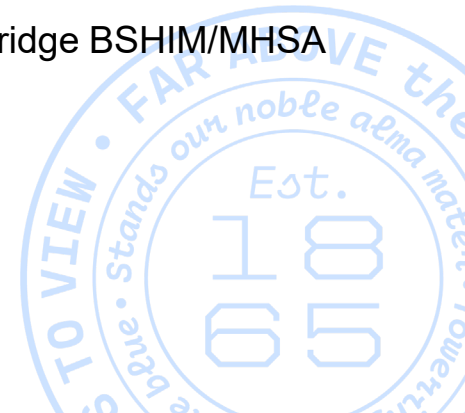

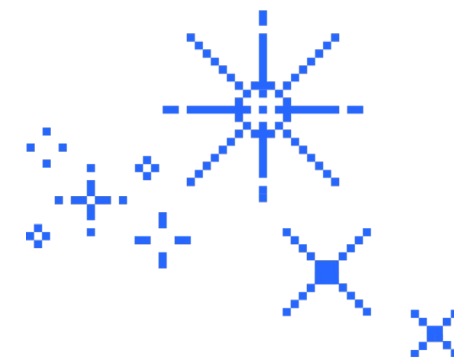
