

Healthcare is a growing industry with a workforce expected to grow 22.2% by 2026.


According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, Health Administration is one of the top ten fastest growing jobs in the healthcare industry.

Health Administration is also one of the top ten highest paying jobs in the healthcare industry
– medical and health services managers earned a median annual salary of \$98,250 in 2017, much higher than the average median salary of \$31,786.
