JOHN BRADY, DHA, FACHE, NAMED 2021 RECIPIENT OF THE GLANDON FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FOR ADVANCEMENT OF HEALTHCARE MANAGEMENT EDUCATION

WASHINGTON, D.C., April 13, 2021 – John Brady, DHA, FACHE, Assistant Professor at Parkinson's School of Health Sciences and Public Health, Loyola University Chicago, has been named the second recipient of the Glandon Family Scholarship for Advancement of Healthcare Management Education. Dr. Brady will be formally recognized at AUPHA's Annual Awards Presentation held virtually later this summer.

The Scholarship was established in the fall of 2019 to create an endowment for a faculty scholarship at an AUPHA member program, with the intent of creating a durable legacy in support of quality healthcare management education. The scholarship is aimed at future educational leaders by giving them recognition and financial support at an early stage of their academic career. The Scholarship is named after former AUPHA President and CEO, Gerald L. Glandon, PhD.

"The Glandon Family Scholarship for Advancement of Healthcare Management Education supports the educational scholarship of early careerist academics in AUPHA's undergraduate and graduate programs," said Dan Gentry, PhD, MHA, President and CEO of AUPHA, and Chair of the Glandon Family Scholarship Selection Committee. "Dr. Brady's portfolio of application materials submitted by him, his Chair, colleagues, and students at Loyola University Chicago was outstanding. John will be able to use the funds to further his scholarship on the education and development of leaders in the field of post-acute care for economically disadvantaged communities."

"I applaud John's plan to assist in the development of leaders in post-acute care facilities located in economically disadvantaged areas," said Leigh W. Cellucci, PhD, MBA, Immediate Past Chair of the AUPHA Board of Directors and member of the Glandon Family Scholarship Selection Committee. "This work embodies the purpose of the award—to educate our future healthcare leaders who will serve the health community at large, and in this case, those who need it most."
