- National, centralized application service enables you to apply to multiple colleges and universities through a single web-based application

- Cohort-based: fall entry only  
| Deadline: July 31

## ❖ Retention Standards

- Maintain 3.00 GPA throughout the program
- Grades of C– or below do not count toward graduation

## ❖ Transfer Credit

- Up to 12 graduate credits may transfer (grade B or better; program approval required).

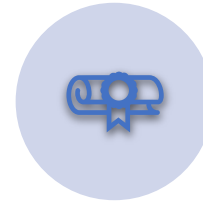

- An online personal interview with the MHA Program Faculty

# Internship



Internship provides opportunities to apply competencies learned in the classroom environment in a healthcare setting and further prepare for leadership roles in healthcare. # Integrative Learning Experience

The Integrative Learning Experience (ILE) has replaced the Capstone course for MHA students. ILE is taken in your last/graduating semester and is focused on application of skills and knowledge gained throughout the MHA Program as well as building career readiness. You must complete all core requirements before you can take ILE, but you can take electives with ILE. ILE includes a presentation, incorporates complex case studies and reflection, and helps you build your career readiness portfolio



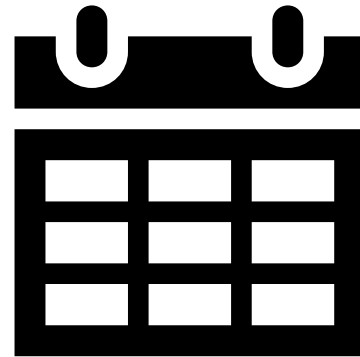

## Center for MCHEER

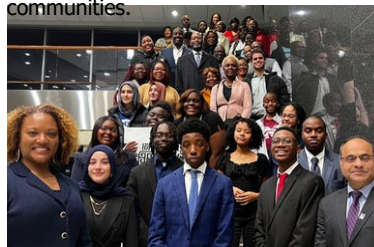

UofM SPH established the Center for Responsible Artificial Intelligence in Public Health (CRAIPH) which serves as a research and training infrastructure to promote the responsible and transparent use of artificial intelligence (AI) technologies in public health.



CRAIPH works with Memphis-area health organizations to develop AI-informed educational programs while piloting AI devices with community partners.

## AI for Health Research Lab

University of Memphis AI for Health Research (UofM-AIHR) Lab is a core initiative of CRAIPH. Funded by the NIH AIM-AHEAD Coordinating Center, the lab addresses pressing public health challenges through responsible use of artificial intelligence and machine learning (AI/ML).

The University of Memphis was 1 of 15 awardees selected for the Program for AI Readiness (PAIR) Cohort 2.

## Community Stress and Well-being Lab

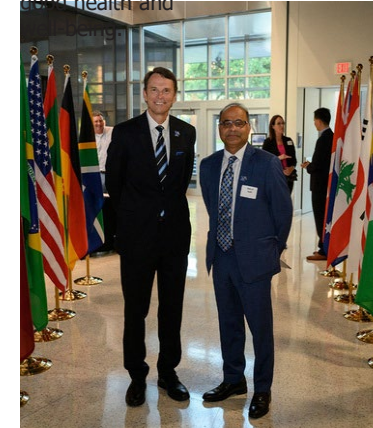
