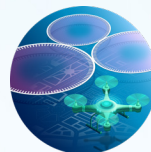




**FLY YOUR DRONE**

## KNOWLEDGE TEST

## DOs

- **REGISTER** your drone
- **FLY** your drone at or below 400 feet, and in controlled airspace be sure to have an approved airspace authorization for your flight
- **KEEP** your drone within your line of sight
- **CHECK** for FAA airspace restrictions
- **RESPECT** privacy

## DON'Ts

- **NEVER FLY** near other aircraft, especially near airports
- **NEVER FLY** over groups of people, public events, or stadiums full of people
- **NEVER FLY** near emergencies such as fires or hurricane recovery efforts
- **NEVER FLY** under the influence of drugs or alcohol
