Some of today's most iconic and popular podcasts started their lives at a radio station. As a community broadcaster you have certain obligations when it comes to podcasting.

Here's what to consider:

Essentials

- Only original spoken-word content or noncopyright audio content can be included in a podcast which is downloadable or available on podcast directories
- Your PPCA license only covers music on air or online streaming. PPCA on demand licenses are a work in progress. The CBAA are currently in negotiations with the PPCA
- Global podcast directories e.g. Spotify or Soundcloud open stations up to international breaches in copyright

Legally sourced music can be found through:

- Obtaining a license direct from the owners
- Producing an original piece of music
- Use royalty-free music that you can purchase with a one-time fee
- Creative Commons and ccMixter
- Free Music Archive discount for NFPs
- <u>APRA AMCOS music production library</u> free for community radio stations
