PAIRING PROCESS

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Mentor-mentee pairings are facilitated by the CFA Society Vancouver Mentorship Committee through a very personalized matching process. The application forms are designed to give the committee the best sense of each applicant – from career history and objectives to personal interests. Mentee applicants can expect a brief phone interview from a pairing committee member. All information collected influences the pairing process. While every effort is taken to match as many applicants as possible, pairing is not guaranteed. The number one priority is to find the strongest fit possible.



PROGRAM SUPPORT

CFA Society Vancouver staff and Mentorship Committee volunteers serve as the program coordinators and provide support to mentors and mentees. The support will consist of:

- Mentorship Program Workbook offering an overview of roles and responsibilities, tips for building the relationship, meeting suggestions, giving (and receiving) feedback and much more.
- **Program Liaison** each pairing will be appointed a committee member to be the program contact and resource for both mentor and mentee.
- April Check In conducted by our committee Program Liaisons. During the one-on-one check in, mentors and mentees will be asked to share experiences and key learnings from Q1 and be open to sharing any challenges.
- Career Development Presentations and Workshops the Mentorship Committee is committed to passing on career development topic suggestions from the mentorship cohort to the Programs Committee. Where applicable, priority registration to career development events will be offered to Mentorship Program participants.
