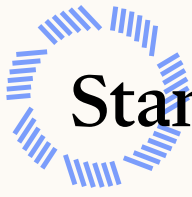

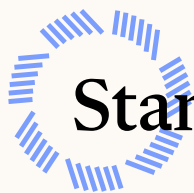

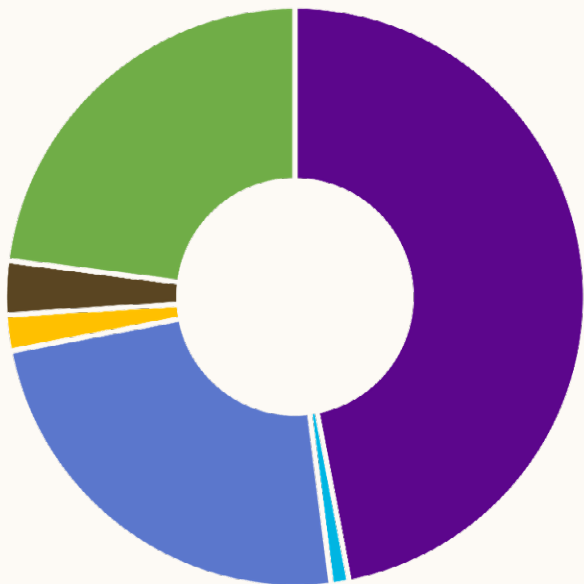
Financial Breakdown

Revenue

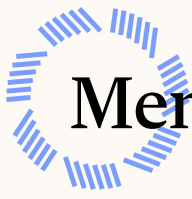

Member Services

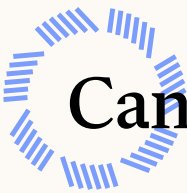
The Society remains committed to delivering exceptional member services and supporting CFA charterholders throughout every stage of their careers. Through a wide range of professional development opportunities, networking events, leadership experiences, and industry engagement initiatives, the Society provides members with the tools, connections, and knowledge needed to thrive in an evolving investment landscape.

Professional development and career advancement remained a central focus in 2026. The Society delivered a diverse range of high-impact learning opportunities, including workshops on Co-Pilot and ChatGPT for Finance Professionals, a Private Equity Bootcamp, Fundamentals of Generative AI, and The Science of Emotional Intelligence. The Programs Committee also welcomed distinguished speakers, including motivational speaker Alan Mallory, and partnered with CPP Investments to showcase recent industry developments and insights. In addition, the Annual Alternative Investment Outlook Forum attracted close to 200 attendees for an engaging discussion featuring a panel of leading industry experts.

The Mentorship Program achieved a record year by pairing 26 mentors and mentees, reinforcing its important role in supporting members throughout their career journeys. The program provides mentees with invaluable access to experienced industry professionals who offer guidance on career planning, industry insights, technical expertise, and the development of essential leadership and interpersonal skills. For mentors, the program offers a meaningful opportunity to give back to the CFA community, strengthen their coaching and leadership capabilities, and gain fresh perspectives from the next generation of finance professionals.

Networking and collaboration remained key pillars in FY26. CFA Society Vancouver continued to strengthen its partnerships with organizations including CPA BC, CBA BC, CAIA, AIMA, and CBV. The Social Committee curated a diverse range of events designed to engage members across all career stages and age groups, including a Philosophy Café, Monte Carlo Night, and the CFA Women's Luncheon. The Committee also introduced new initiatives such as a Night at Nat Bailey and participation in the Sun Run, where 24 members proudly represented the Society on race day. The WhatsApp Meetups continued to provide an accessible and informal way for members across all career stages, age groups, and locations to connect and build meaningful relationships.

The 23rd Annual Charter Awards Ceremony was a highlight of the year, celebrating the accomplishments of 42 new charterholders from the 2025 cohort. Held for a second consecutive year at The Vancouver Club, the event featured an elegant dinner service and a distinguished atmosphere that reflected the significance of this professional milestone. The ceremony also continued to provide complimentary professional headshots, offering new charterholders an added opportunity to support their career development.



Candidate Support

CFA Society Vancouver's candidate support strategy in FY26 continued to focus on three key areas: Exam Support, Career Development, and Community Building. These efforts underscore the Society's ongoing commitment to supporting candidates throughout their CFA Program journey and equipping them for future success as CFA charterholders.

Exam Support

Preparing for the CFA exam is a critical step in the candidate journey and foundational to the strength of our future membership. In FY26, CFA Society Vancouver hosted five well-attended Level I and II workshops led by UBC professor and long-standing Society member, Darren Degraaf, CFA and a new instructor, Richie Owens, CFA, from our partner preparation provider Cerifi Meldrum. These sessions covered key curriculum topics, including Financial Statement Analysis, Equity Investments and Ethics, and provided candidates with practical insights and strategies.

To further support exam readiness, the Society organized a LI webinar designed to help candidates better understand the structure, expectations, and procedures of the computer-based exam format, ensuring they felt confident and well-prepared on exam day.

Career Development

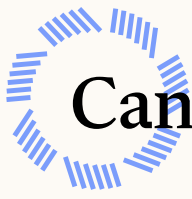
Supporting candidates' professional growth beyond the exam remained a key priority throughout the year. One highlight was the highly successful Career Roundtable event, featuring expert presentations from Isabel Lee of McNeill Nakamoto Recruitment Group and Kaushal Parikh of Leith Wheeler Investment Counsel.

Together, they shared practical guidance on developing compelling résumés and cover letters, refining interview skills, and building a strong professional presence.

The event also brought together several CFA charterholders who participated in roundtable discussions, giving candidates the opportunity to hear firsthand accounts of diverse career journeys, ask thoughtful questions, and build meaningful professional connections. These conversations helped bridge the gap between exam preparation and the realities of the investment profession, enabling candidates to better envision their future paths as charterholders.

Building on this momentum, the Society introduced an in-person Coffee Chat event focused on the art of informational interviewing, an essential skill for cultivating professional relationships and exploring career opportunities. Special thanks to Karim Allibhai, CFA, and Sasha Evens, CFA, for generously sharing their experiences and offering practical advice on how candidates can approach and maximize informational interviews effectively.

The Day in the Life webinar series further expanded candidates' exposure to the profession by connecting them directly with CFA charterholders working across a range of industries and roles. Speakers provided candid insights into their day-to-day responsibilities and reflected on how earning the CFA charter helped shape and advance their careers. In addition, Isabel Lee hosted a follow-up webinar dedicated to résumé and cover letter critiques, offering personalized feedback that helped candidates strengthen their professional presentation and approach the job market with greater confidence.



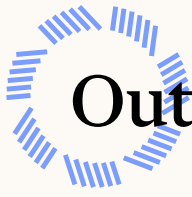
Candidate Support

Community Building

The Society believes that today's candidates are tomorrow's colleagues, collaborators, and leaders. With this in mind, CFA Society Vancouver hosted a series of social and networking events designed to foster early relationship-building, friendship, and a strong sense of community among candidates. Highlights included the Meet Your Peers pub night and an end-of-year social event, which provided candidates with opportunities to connect with peers, share experiences, and build meaningful relationships beyond the exam process.

Candidate Associate Members were also welcomed into a number of charterholder events, including the WhatsApp Meet Ups and the HaraHeri! social event. These initiatives created valuable opportunities for candidates to engage directly with CFA charterholders and investment professionals, expand their networks, and gain exposure to the broader investment community. By encouraging these connections early in the candidate journey, the Society continues to strengthen and grow a supportive and engaged candidate community.

Through a comprehensive approach to exam preparation, career advancement, and community engagement, CFA Society Vancouver continues to support candidates not only as they progress through the CFA Program but also as they begin shaping their professional futures.



Outreach Initiatives

In FY26, CFA Society Vancouver continued to strengthen awareness of both the Society and the value of the CFA designation through a broad range of strategic initiatives engaging employers, regulators, students, and the wider investment community. Through impactful partnerships, educational programming, and community outreach, the Society reinforced its position as a trusted voice within the profession while highlighting the expertise and integrity associated with the CFA charter.

A key achievement this year was the Society's collaboration with the BC Securities Commission during Fraud Awareness Month to deliver an in-person investor education session at the Vancouver Public Library focused on fraud prevention and investor protection. The Financial Literacy Committee also expanded its public outreach efforts by hosting its first national webinar, Raising Financially Confident Children, which attracted more than 100 registrants. In addition, the Committee developed a series of animated YouTube videos on compound interest, extending the Society's educational reach through accessible digital content.

The Society also continued to build strong connections within the academic community. The University Outreach team engaged with students at UBC, SFU, Douglas College, University Canada West, and New York Institute of Technology to promote the benefits of the CFA Program and the pathway to becoming a CFA charterholder. This year also marked the launch of the Committee's inaugural university luncheon, bringing together faculty, career centre professionals, and local HR leaders to foster collaboration and strengthen industry-academic relationships. To support ongoing engagement, the team introduced a bi-annual newsletter highlighting Society initiatives, student development opportunities, and valuable CFA Institute resources.

Through the CFA Institute Research Challenge and the CFA Societies Canada's Ethics Challenge, the University Outreach Case Competitions team worked closely with local universities to support students participating in high-level academic competitions. Research Challenge participants analyzed Intact Insurance, while Ethics Challenge teams presented solutions to a real-world ethical scenario before a panel of industry judges. These initiatives continue to provide students with valuable real-world experience, professional mentorship, and exposure to the investment industry.

By delivering meaningful engagement across multiple audiences and platforms, CFA Society Vancouver remains committed to advancing the investment profession, promoting the value of the CFA charter, and demonstrating the benefits of hiring CFA charterholders across industries.
